Inland Beach Recreational Monitoring

- Statewide objectives exist within the Bacteria Provisions for inland surface waters, enclosed bays and estuaries.
- No statewide monitoring exists...yet
- Sporadic monitoring from regional water boards, tribal governments, and local community groups.
- Has and continues to be a data gap within the Safe to Swim Network.

Assembly Bill No. 1066 (Bloom, 2021)

- Signed into law October 8, 2021 – [Priority inland water-contact recreation sites: water quality monitoring.](#)
- Lays the groundwork for defining what a priority inland water contact recreation site is, and what a statewide monitoring program should include.
- Names the California Water Quality Monitoring Council as the primary implementation entity in coordination with the Water Board and California Department of Public Health.

AB 1066 Mandates

- July 1, 2022 – The Council directs a workgroup to study recreation hazards at priority water contact recreation sites.
- July 1, 2023 – The workgroup submits a report to the Council identifying water contact recreation sites along with the hazards associated with contact recreation and how to reduce those risks.
- December 31, 2023 – The Council proposes to the State Board a definition of a priority water contact recreation site, and recommendations and requirements for establishing a monitoring program.

Current Implementation Status

- Plan is to tentatively utilize the Inland Beach Monitoring Workgroup.
- CDPH received funding to support a staff person Joe Christen to help co-chair the workgroup.
- Water Board was unfunded and looking for staff to support the workgroup.
