

STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD
RESOLUTION NO. 83-40
APPROVING THE FINAL 205(j) WATER QUALITY
MANAGEMENT PLANNING PROJECT WORKPLANS

WHEREAS:

1. The 1981 amendments to the Clean Water Act added Section 205(j) authorizing states to use up to a maximum of 1 percent of their Section 201 Clean Water Grant Funds for water quality management planning.
2. A total of \$3,627,640 in federal 205(j) grant funds currently are available; \$1,878,000 for federal fiscal year 1981-82 and \$1,749,640 for federal fiscal year 1982-83.
3. The grant will require a total of \$1,166,501 in matching funds including \$597,426 of matching funds for State Board and Regional Board projects.
4. After extensive public review and comment, the State Water Resources Control Board on March 2, 1983, adopted the 205(j) project priority list.
5. The State Water Resources Control Board requested applicants within the fundable portion of the 205(j) project priority list to prepare workplans.
6. The State Water Resources Control Board has reviewed the final 205(j) project workplans and determined that there are significant problems with the following project workplans:
 - o Program for Management of Small Quantities of Hazardous Wastes (San Bernardino County)
 - o Delta operations Water Quality (SWRCB-Special Projects)
 - o Santa Rosa Ground Water Basin Management Plan (Camrosa County Water District/City of Thousand Oaks)
 - o Phenols Migration Analysis and Corrective Action (Kern County COG).
7. The State Water Resources Control Board believes that projects proposed by San Bernardino County, Southern California Association of Governments and the Association of Bay Area Governments would benefit from a review of these agencies' 205(j) workplans by State agencies with responsibilities for regulating hazardous waste management and disposal.
8. The State Water Resources Control Board has determined that all projects should be approved with certain projects to be approved with conditions and qualifications.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the applicants for 205(j) funds for the "Program for Management of Small Quantities of Hazardous Waste" (San Bernardino County) "Santa Rosa Ground Water Basin Management Plan" (Camrosa County Water District/City of Thousand Oaks) and "Phenols Migration Analysis and Corrective Action" (Kern County COG) be given until June 30, 1983, to submit satisfactory project workplans to the Executive Director. After June 30, 1983 funding for any of these projects for which there is not a satisfactory workplan shall be passed on to the next highest priority projects on the final 205(j) Project Priority List.
2. That approval of the 205(j) workplans for the "Program for Management of Small Quantities of Hazardous Waste," (San Bernardino County), Toxic/Hazardous Waste Management Plan for Small Generators (Southern California Association of Governments) and "Investigation of Improper Hazardous Waste Disposal from Small Sources" (Association of Bay Area Governments) is contingent on revision of the project workplans in accordance with appropriate changes approved by the Executive director or his designee based on comments made by the Hazardous Waste Management Council, California Waste Management Board, Air Resources Board, Department of Health Services and the State Water Resources Control Board.
3. No expenditure of funds for the "Delta Operations Water Quality" project is authorized until supplemental funding is obtained from the Striped Bass Stamp Fund and U.S. Geological Survey. Funding for this project may be reduced or terminated if the Central Valley Project and State Water Project fail to curtail pumping during the 3-4 week early spring sampling period during more than one year. Continued funding of this project under these conditions shall be subject to annual project evaluations by the State Water Resources Control Board Project Manager.
4. That the State Water Resources Control Board approves, without conditions, all other 205(j) workplans listed in Attachment 1 to this resolution.
5. That the Executive Director shall transmit all of the 205(j) project workplans to the EPA Region IX Regional Administrator for approval.
6. That the Executive Director shall request the Regional Administrator, Region IX to approve a grant of 205(j) water quality management planning funds in the amount of \$3,002,640 to fund the federal share of the 205(j) projects.
7. That the Executive Director is authorized to negotiate and execute all contracts necessary to implement the workplans approved by the Board for 205(j) water quality management planning.
