RESOLUTION NO. 88-60

APPROVAL TO AWARD SUPPLEMENTAL STATE GRANT ASSISTANCE TO SEVERAL  
SMALL COMMUNITIES

WHEREAS:


1. The following small communities have requested supplemental state grant assistance, under the Clean Water Bond Law of 1984. The following estimated supplemental grant amounts have been computed by the Division of Loans and Grants in accordance with the State Board's Implementation Plan and Policy dated May 1985: Upper Lake (Lake County) -- C-06-1337-110 (\$1,300,000); Clear Lake Oaks -- C-06-2947-110 (\$838,200); Bolinas Mesa (Marin County) -- C-06-2979-110 (\$673,000); Bolinas Downtown (Bolinas Community Public Utility District) -- C-06-2980-110, (\$412,503); and City of Portola -- C-06-1630-110 (\$646,000). In accordance with the Board's Implementation Plan and Policy, the amount of the loan will be adjusted at the time of approval to award.
2. The Division of Loans and Grants has determined that the proposed projects are the most cost-effective solutions to the water quality or public health problems;
3. The State Board's Implementation Plan and Policy, dated May 1985, provides that the amount of the supplemental grant be determined by using the formula contained in that document, provided that the total amount of combined grant assistance shall not exceed 97-1/2 percent of the total project cost;
4. The State Board may at its option award a supplemental grant less than that amount determined by using the formula referred to in (3) above.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE STATE BOARD:

1. Has determined that the above listed projects are eligible for supplemental grants under the 1984 Clean Water Bond law; and
2. Approves the award of supplemental state grant assistance for the above listed projects in the approximate amounts indicated.
