INFORMATIONAL REPORT ON CALIFORNIA'S AREA OF ORIGIN LAWS

California Water Code Section 85230(d) directs the State's Delta Watermaster (Watermaster) to submit regular reports to the State Water Board on water rights administration, water quality issues, and conveyance operations. The Watermaster has completed a report on <u>California's</u> <u>Area of Origin Laws</u>.

The report discusses the topic of California's Area of Origin Laws. The report notes that Area of Origin is a major water issue in California. There are five Area of Origin Laws enacted to protect water supplies in California and ensure that local water supplies would be maintained for future needs while allowing for export needs. The report reviews recent court cases involving Area of Origin Laws, including a discussion on interpretation and intent of the laws.
