**SUBJECT**

CONSIDERATION OF A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR, DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES, TO EXECUTE INTERAGENCY AGREEMENTS WITH THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH (CDPH) ~~TO REIMBURSE THEM FOR FACILITY COSTS FOR DIVISION OF DRINKING WATER STAFF WHO WILL CONTINUE TO BE HOUSED IN A CDPH FACILITY.~~ **FOR FACILITY OPERATIONS**

**DISCUSSION**

As part of the transition of the Drinking Water Program from the CDPH to the Water Board it is necessary to enter in to two interagency agreements with CDPH to pay for facility space for both the short term housing of Sacramento staff (less than one year) and long term housing of the Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program (ELAP) staff in Richmond. The temporary lease for the Sacramento staff is necessary, as it is anticipated to take up to six or seven months to reorganize existing office space within the Cal/EPA building so to accommodate the relocation of approximately 110 incoming staff from CDPH. Currently, the Water Board is negotiating with other BDOs regarding available building space and planning to implement multiple internal moves to free up offices and cubicle areas. A second interagency agreement is necessary for ELAP staff to remain located within the CDPH Richmond complex so to continue business operations that rely heavily upon laboratory functions and equipment. The term of the interagency agreement for leased space at the CDPH Richmond Complex is proposed for 3 years. The Water Board does not have any existing laboratory facilities where this type of work could be performed.

**POLICY ISSUE**

Should the State Water Board approve a resolution to allow the Deputy Director, Division of Administrative Services, to enter in to an Interagency Agreement with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to pay for facility space for Division of Drinking Water (DDW) staff that will continue to be housed in a CDPH facility as proposed by staff?

**FISCAL IMPACT**

None, funding for all facility costs related to the DDW moving to the Water Board is included in the FY 2014-15 budget.

**REGIONAL BOARD IMPACT**

None.

## **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

That the State Water Board approves the resolution to allow the Deputy Director, Division of Administrative Services, to enter into an Interagency agreement with CDPH as proposed by staff.

State Water Board action on this item will assist the Water Boards in reaching Goal 7 of the Strategic Plan Update: 2008-2012 to ensure that the Water Boards have access to information and expertise, including employees with appropriate knowledge and skills, needed to effectively and efficiently carry out the Water Boards' mission.

### WHEREAS:

1. The Legislature is considering a proposal in the Governor's Budget to transfer the Drinking Water Program from CDPH to a new Division of Drinking Water within the Water Board on July 1, 2014.
2. Staff transferred from the CPDH to the new Division of Drinking Water (DDW) within the State Water Board will continue to be housed in a CDPH owned facility for both the short term (East End Complex) and long term (Richmond Lab).
3. Approval of interagency agreements will be necessary to allow the State Water Board to reimburse CDPH for the costs associated with facility space utilized for Water Board staff.
4. Funding for the interagency agreements to cover facilities costs will be budgeted as part of the DDW's annual budget.

### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The State Water Board authorizes the Deputy Director, Division of Administrative Services, to execute interagency agreements not to exceed in total the amount budgeted for facility operations and up to \$1,000,000 per fiscal year for contracts with CDPH for space needs for DDW staff through fiscal year 2018-19.
