# NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND WEBINAR ON THE DRAFT SEAWATER DESALINATION SITING AND STREAMLINING REPORT TO EXPEDITE PERMITTING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT WRITTEN COMMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) on the draft Seawater Desalination Siting and Streamlining Report to Expedite Permitting (Draft Report) that was developed in response to direction in <a href="California's Water Supply Strategy: Adapting to a Hotter, Drier Future">California's Water Supply Strategy: Adapting to a Hotter, Drier Future</a> (Water Supply Strategy). The Draft Report has no regulatory force or effect, and solely serves to identify potential streamlining pathways and actions consistent with existing laws and regulations. State Water Board staff is seeking public comments on the Draft Report and will consider all comments prior to finalizing the report and submitting it to the Governor's Office.

### **BACKGROUND**

On August 11, 2022, Governor Newsom released the Water Supply Strategy to update state priority actions to address current and anticipated water supply shortages due to long-term drought and the more extreme weather patterns caused by climate change. To offset the water supplies California could lose over the next two decades, the Strategy prioritizes actions to conserve, capture, recycle, and desalinate more water. The Water Supply Strategy outlines implementation steps to improve the permitting process for seawater desalination and provide guidance to owners or operators proposing to develop new or expanded seawater desalination facilities. This public notice relates to the following Water Supply Strategy implementation action for seawater desalination projects:

"The State will help streamline and expedite permitting to provide better clarity and certainty to further desalination projects. To this end, by June 30, 2023, the State Water Board, Coastal Commission, Department of Water Resources and other State entities (e.g., State Lands Commission) will develop criteria for siting of desalination facilities along the coast and recommend new standards to facilitate approval."

State Water Board staff convened a working group comprised of representatives from partner agencies listed in the <u>Seawater Desalination Interagency Memorandum of Agreement</u>, with additional representation from: California Ocean Protection Council, California Natural Resources Agency, California Department of Water Resources, and California State Coastal Conservancy (interagency group). State Water Board staff in coordination with the interagency group developed the Draft Report that identifies

criteria for siting seawater desalination facilities where they are cost-effective and environmentally appropriate, to streamline and facilitate approval under existing regulatory requirements, as well as potential changes to the requirements. The Draft Report also identifies actions that could be implemented by project proponents and permitting agencies to better facilitate approval of seawater desalination projects given additional resources and regulatory or process changes.

Permitting agencies intend to engage collaboratively with interested persons and Tribes to solicit input on any potential regulatory changes for seawater desalination project planning or permit review. The interagency group will continue coordination to uphold commitments identified in the Draft Report and to address the remaining Water Supply Strategy seawater desalination implementation actions consistent with the agencies' applicable public processes.
