CALIFORNIA REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD CENTRAL VALLEY REGION

MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM NO. R5-2011-R5075 FOR VERONA VILLAGE RESORT AND MARINA WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY SUTTER COUNTY

This Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) describes requirements for monitoring the treatment system septic/grease tanks, effluent, mound dispersal system, and sludge disposal. This MRP is issued pursuant to Water Code Section 13267. The Discharger shall not implement any changes to this MRP unless and until a revised MRP is issued by the Executive Officer.

Section 13267 of the California Water Code states, in part:

"In conducting an investigation specified in subdivision (a), the regional board may require that any person who has discharged, discharges, or is suspected of having discharged or discharging, or who proposes to discharge waste within its region, or any citizen or domiciliary, or political agency or entity of this state who has discharged, discharges, or is suspected of having discharged or discharging, or who proposes to discharge, waste outside of its region that could affect the quality of waters within its region shall furnish, under penalty of perjury, technical or monitoring program reports which the regional board requires. The burden, including costs, of these reports shall bear a reasonable relationship to the need for the report and the benefits to be obtained from the reports. In requiring those reports, the regional board shall provide the person with a written explanation with regard to the need for the reports, and shall identify the evidence that supports requiring that person to provide the reports."

Section 13268 of the California Water Code states, in part:

"(a) Any person failing or refusing to furnish technical or monitoring program reports as required by subdivision (b) of Section 13267, or failing or refusing to furnish a statement of compliance as required by subdivision (b) of Section 13399.2, or falsifying and information provided therein, is guilty of a misdemeanor and may be liable civilly in accordance with subdivision (b). (b)(1) Civil liability may be administratively imposed by a regional board in accordance with Article 2.5 (commencing with section 13323) of Chapter 5 for a violation of subdivision (a) in an amount which shall not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each day in which the violation occurs."

The Discharger owns and operates the facility that is subject to the Notice of Applicability (NOA) of Water Quality Order No. 97-10-DWQ. The reports are necessary to ensure that the Discharger complies with the NOA and WQO. Pursuant to Section 13267 of the California Water Code, the Discharger shall implement this MRP and shall submit the monitoring reports described herein.

All samples shall be representative of the volume and nature of the discharge or matrix of material sampled. The time, date, and location of each grab sample shall be recorded on the sample chain of custody form.

Field test instruments (such as those used to test pH, dissolved oxygen, and electrical conductivity) may be used provided that:

- 1. The user is trained in proper use and maintenance of the instruments;
- 2. The instruments are field calibrated prior to monitoring events at the frequency recommended by the manufacturer;
- 3. Instruments are serviced and/or calibrated by the manufacturer at the recommended frequency; and
- 4. Field calibration reports are submitted as described in the "Reporting" section of this MRP.

SEPTIC TANK/GREASE TRAP MONITORING

All site septic tanks (including septic tanks, grease traps, and holding tanks) shall be inspected and/or pumped at least as frequently as described below. Inspections of sludge and scum depth are not required if the tanks are pumped at least annually.

Septic tanks shall be pumped when any one of the following conditions exist or may occur before the next inspection:

- a. The combined thickness of sludge and scum exceeds one-third of the tank depth of the first compartment: or,
- b. The scum layer is within three inches of the outlet device; or,
- c. The sludge layer is within eight inches of the outlet device.

EFFLUENT MONITORING

Samples of effluent shall be taken from the wastewater treatment plant effluent or downstream of the 2,500 gallon holding tank. At a minimum, effluent monitoring shall consist of the following:

¹ At a minimum, the total flow shall be measured weekly to calculate the average daily flow for the week. ² Total supported solids shall be determined using a Whatman glass fiber filter with a nominal norm size of

Total suspended solids shall be determined using a Whatman glass fiber filter with a nominal pore size of 1.58 um, or equivalent.

MOUND DISPERSAL AREA

The mound dispersal area and the automatic distributing valves shall be monitored for proper operation. Monitoring shall include, at a minimum, the following:

¹ All automatic distributing valves shall be inspected for signs of proper operation as recommended by the manufacturer.

² Inspect perimeter base of the mound for signs of wastewater seepage or saturated soil conditions.

- ³ Shallow rooted plants on and around the mound are acceptable, deep rooted plants such as trees shall be removed immediately.
- ⁴ Evidence of animals burrowing in the mound shall be immediately investigated and burrowing animal populations controlled immediately.

SLUDGE DISPOSAL MONITORING

The Discharger shall monitor the quantity of sludge removed from the treatment system for disposal. Records shall include the name/contact information for the hauling company, the type and amount of waste transported, the date removed from the facility, the disposal facility name and address, and copies of all analytical data required by the entity accepting the waste. These records shall be submitted as part of the Annual Monitoring Report.

REPORTING

In reporting monitoring data, the Discharger shall arrange the data in tabular form so that the date, sample type (e.g., effluent, sludge, etc.), and reported analytical or visual inspection result are readily discernible. The data shall be summarized in such a manner to clearly illustrate compliance with the NOA and spatial or temporal trends, as applicable. The results of any monitoring done more frequently than required at the locations specified in the Monitoring and Reporting Program shall be reported to the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board).

A. Quarterly Monitoring Reports

Quarterly reports shall be submitted to the Central Valley Water Board on the **first day of the second month after the quarter ends** (e.g. the January - March Quarterly Report is due by 1 May). The reports shall bear the certification and signature of the Discharger's authorized representative. At a minimum, the quarterly reports shall include:

- 1. Results of effluent and mound dispersal area monitoring.
- 2. A comparison of monitoring data to the discharge specifications, disclosure of any violations of the NOA and/or WQO, and an explanation of any violation of those requirements. Data shall be presented in tabular format.
- 3. Copies of current calibration logs for all field test instruments.
- 4. If requested by staff, copies of laboratory analytical report(s).

B. Annual Report

In addition to the quarterly reports, an Annual Report shall be submitted. The Annual Report shall be submitted to the Central Valley Water Board by **1 February** each year. The Annual Report shall include the following:

- 1. Results of septic tank/grease trap monitoring and any characterization of sludge required by the disposal facility.
- 2. Tabular and graphical summaries of all data collected during the year.
- 3. An evaluation of the performance of the WWTF, including discussion of capacity issues, nuisance conditions, system problems, and a forecast of the flows anticipated in the next year.
- 4. A discussion of compliance and the corrective action taken, as well as any planned or proposed actions needed to bring the discharge into full compliance with the NOA and/or WQO.
- 5. A discussion of any data gaps and potential deficiencies/redundancies in the monitoring system or reporting program.

6. The name and contact information for the wastewater operator responsible for operation, maintenance, and system monitoring.

A letter transmitting the self-monitoring reports shall accompany each report. The letter shall include a discussion of requirement violations found during the reporting period, and actions taken or planned for correcting noted violations, such as operation or facility modifications. If the Discharger has previously submitted a report describing corrective actions and/or a time schedule for implementing the corrective actions, reference to the previous correspondence will be satisfactory. The transmittal letter shall contain the following penalty of perjury statement and shall be signed by the Discharger or the Discharger's authorized agent:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted in this document and all attachments and that, based on my inquiry of the those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the information is true, accurate, and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment."

The Discharger shall implement the above monitoring program as of the date of this Order. Ordered by:
