NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
concerning

**TIME SCHEDULE ORDER
REQUIRING THE EL DORADO IRRIGATION DISTRICT
EL DORADO HILLS WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT
TO COMPLY WITH REQUIREMENTS PRESCRIBED IN
WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER NO. R5-2007-0069
(NPDES PERMIT NO. CA0078671)
EL DORADO COUNTY**

The El Dorado Irrigation District owns and operates the El Dorado Hills Wastewater Treatment Plant that serves the community of El Dorado Hills. The treatment plant is designed to discharge up to 4.0 million gallons per day of Title 22 tertiary treated wastewater. The United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board have classified this discharge as a major discharge. Tertiary-treated municipal wastewater is discharged to Carson Creek, a tributary to Deer Creek, a tributary to Cosumnes River within the San Joaquin River Watershed.

On 22 June 2007, the Central Valley Water Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R5-2007-0069 (NPDES No. CA0078671) prescribing waste discharge requirements for the El Dorado Hills Wastewater Treatment Plant. The Waste Discharge Requirements contain, in part, final effluent limitations for bis(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate, copper, cyanide, dibromochloromethane, dichlorobromomethane, and zinc that become effective 18 May 2010, and for persistent chlorinated hydrocarbon pesticides that become effective 18 May 2012. The proposed Time Schedule Order provides a time schedule for the Discharger to come into compliance with the final effluent limitations for dibromochloromethane, dichlorobromomethane, copper, zinc, bis(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate, cyanide, and persistent chlorinated hydrocarbon pesticides. The proposed Times Schedule Order also provides a time schedule for the Discharger to come into compliance with the interim effluent limitation for gamma-BHC, heptachlor, and dalapon.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are

interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Board no later than **22 February 2010**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than 5:00 pm on **22 February 2010**. Written evidence or comments submitted after 5:00 pm on **22 February 2010** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
