Dear Regional Water Quality Board;

I live on the adjacent property. I thank you for being proactive. I request that you please enforce measures to ensure our property is protected from any fugitive lime dust and the contents therein. This is a nuisance and is adversely affecting the horse shows, horse boarding, our health and enjoyment of the property.

Place measures and testing; such that the lime dust stays on their site and is not allowed to drift onto neighboring properties and agricultural fields. Preferably by tarping any lime dust, exposed hills sides and areas. Limit loading and removal of lime to small areas that can be controlled and covered each night.


Provide that the area being worked on has sprinklers and on site water

Provide regulations requiring cleaning and immediate removal of their track out from the lime pit on to the neighboring road 100B, as is consistent with any construction site. Also, have lime, soil and water tested in various locations on the site where there were any unlined mudd or lime ponds from the sugar factory for any contaminants including asbestos.

We would also request that they are required to remediate our site by removing any and all lime and lime dust that has come on to our structures and property. If lime has spilled on our soil, that that soil is removed and new top soil of the same composition is brought in.

We do not understand why they have been allowed to make a bigger mess by flattening and exposing large amounts of un settled loose lime.
