**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**  
concerning

**WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
FOR**

**PACTIV LLC  
CLASS III SOLID WASTE LANDFILL  
BUTTE COUNTY**

Pactiv LLC (hereafter Discharger) owns and operates a Class III solid waste landfill in Red Bluff, Tehama County. The landfill consists of one unlined waste management unit (Unit) covering approximately 10.2 acres of the 100 acre facility. Pactiv LLC operates a molded pulp processing plant for production of paper plates. Wastewater generated during the production of the paper plates is discharged to a series of treatment ponds where pulp solids are allowed to settle. Periodically, the paper pulp solids are collected, dried, and ultimately discharged to the Pactiv LLC on-site Class III landfill. The landfill currently operates under Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. 91-064. Order No. 91-064 is being revised to incorporate applicable provisions of California Code of Regulations, Title 27.

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) will consider adopting the revised Order. A public hearing to address this matter will be held during the Central Valley Water Board meeting which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- Pactiv LLC

Designated parties but not interested persons will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Central Valley Water Board staff will prepare the administrative record, and may present evidence, make an oral presentation and cross-examine opposing witnesses.

Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses, and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **9 December 2013**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

The tentative Waste Discharge Requirements and Monitoring and Reporting Program were issued on **8 November 2013**. Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 9 December 2013**. Written materials submitted after 5:00 p.m. on the above date will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from Board members, counsel staff or others, at the discretion of the Board.
