NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
concerning

**RENEWAL OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
(NPDES NO. CA0079138)
AND
TIME SCHEDULE ORDER
FOR
CITY OF STOCKTON
REGIONAL WASTEWATER CONTROL FACILITY
SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY**

The City of Stockton (Discharger) owns and operates the Regional Wastewater Control Facility (Facility) that provides sewerage service for the City of Stockton, Port of Stockton and surrounding unincorporated areas of San Joaquin County and serves a population of approximately 326,000. The Facility is currently authorized to discharge up to 55 million gallons per day (MGD) of tertiary-treated municipal wastewater to the San Joaquin River, within the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) have classified this discharge a major discharge.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2008-0154, issued by the Central Valley Water Board on 23 October 2008, and Time Schedule Order R5-2013-1010 issued on 23 July 2013. The proposed NPDES permit renewal includes new or revised effluent limits for ammonia (as N), bromoform, chlorpyrifos, chlorodibromomethane (CDBM), diazinon, dichlorobromomethane (DCBM), mercury (total), methylmercury and nitrate+nitrite (as N). The proposed renewal also removes the effluent limits for aluminum, bis(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate, cyanide, dissolved oxygen, manganese and molybdenum, because the discharge no longer exhibits reasonable potential to cause or contribute to the applicable water quality objectives for these constituents. A permit alternative for the regulation of nitrate+nitrite (as N) is also included and will be considered by the Central Valley Water Board at the subject public hearing. The proposed NPDES permit renewal does not allow for an increase in the discharge from the current permit.

A Time Schedule Order (TSO) is also proposed to continue the compliance schedules to comply with the effluent limitations for CDBM and DCBM. The proposed TSO is being reissued to be consistent with the proposed NPDES permit renewal. There are no substantive changes to previous TSO R5-2013-0101.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the

evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 25 April 2014**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 25 April 2014**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m. on 25 April 2014** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
