**Re: Comments Regarding Tentative Waste Discharge Requirements
(NPDES Permit No. CA0081558) for City of Manteca and Dutra Farms, Inc.
Wastewater Quality Control Facility**

To Whom It May Concern:

Neighbors United (NU) is submitting this letter to comment on the planned acceptance of tentative Waste Discharge Requirements involving the City of Manteca's (the City's) National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the discharge of tertiary water produced by the City's wastewater treatment plant. The City's tertiary-treated effluent water discharged during summer months averages an EC of 763 micromhos per centimeter¹, ($\mu\text{mhos/cm}$), above the current summer Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) effluent limits of 700 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$. (See Exhibit "1") The City of Manteca has made improvements in reducing effluent EC levels by 25%² from 2004-2005 EC effluent levels. Despite this noted improvement, the City of Manteca has expressed that it "would be a financial burden" to put in place infrastructure required to reduce EC levels to comply with WDRs and subsequently requested consideration of a variance to discharge at higher EC levels, which the City of Manteca has failed to meet in the past. In addition, the discharge of fecal coliform in the wastewater on December 21, 2014, was measured at elevated levels of 920 Most Probable Number coliforms per 100 milliliter (MPN/100 ml)³, when only 240 MPN/100 ml is allowed, thus exhibiting that the current treatment facility may have issues treating discharged water with the current technology being utilized at the wastewater treatment facility.

New funding granted by the passage of the Water Quality, Supply and Infrastructure Act of 2014, or Proposition 1, from the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) will become available for allocation within the 2015 calendar year to applicants who meet SWRCB required guidelines. Within Proposition 1, funding has been specifically set aside for water recycling use.

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In this time of extreme and exceptional drought in California, all sources of usable water should be investigated. Proposition 1 was created and passed in order to improve the water supply in these extraordinarily difficult times. Included in Proposition 1 is \$725 million for water recycling, including the use and testing of new treatment technologies. Guidelines for eligibility for funding are to be published by the SWRCB within the first half of the 2015 calendar year. Prior to consideration of the adoption of the Tentative WDRs for the City's NPDES permit, NU requests the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) to require the City to investigate as to whether upgrading their facility is possible through the new water recycling funding program.

The City appears to be overdue for upgrades, based on the lack of corrective actions for their various NPDES discharge violations. In the past, the City has indicated a lack of funding for upgrades as the reason for wastewater violations of the NPDES. With the use of state funding for recycled water programs, the City could significantly increase the re-use of tertiary wastewater. In addition to the granted money from Proposition 1, Governor Brown's declaration of emergency drought led the SWRCB to approve \$800 million in low-interest loans for recycled water projects.

With the advancement of wastewater treatment technology, many municipalities have been able to utilize recycled water for food crops. It is NU's understanding that the Monterey Water Pollution Control Agency is currently utilizing gaseous chlorine treatment technology to provide recycled water for more delicate food crops such as lettuce, strawberries, and artichokes. It is also NU's understanding that the Del Puerto Water District, serving the Patterson area, is currently negotiating the purchase of recycled water from the City of Modesto for agricultural purposes. Tulare Irrigation District is also looking to utilize water processed through a membrane bioreactor from the City of Visalia wastewater treatment facility. Currently, the City of Manteca, in conjunction with Dutra Farms, Inc., is using their recycled water for land application for crops such alfalfa and silage for cattle fodder and not for use on food crops.

With this in mind, NU would like to add that for some time now, NU has requested that public workshops and stakeholder meetings be held to allow for public input. **(See Exhibit "2")**

In fact, in October 2014, NU was presented a City of Manteca Wastewater Treatment Facility Project Plan flowchart that clearly demonstrated that public information meetings would be held on November 18, 2014, December 23, 2014 and January 20, 2015. **(See Exhibit "3")**

Further, on December 15, 2014, the City of Manteca was presented a list of stakeholders and other interested parties who showed interest in participating in the meetings. **(See Exhibit "4")**

To date, NU is not aware of any public workshop or stakeholder meeting being held that would allow for meaningful public input.

For this reason, it is the opinion of NU that the City should make the due effort to improve and upgrade the wastewater treatment facility and apply for the newly-approved funding in order to expand the use

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of recycled water generated by the City's wastewater treatment facility. It is important to add that eligibility for Proposition 1 funding will require that the City adhere to guidelines that are planned to be released in early 2015.

This causes NU to respectfully request that prior to accepting a motion to adopt WDRs for the City's NPDES permit, that the RWQCB allow for the new and currently undetermined SWRCB guidelines to be considered prior to adoption of the tentative WDRs. This will allow for more beneficial uses of recycled water that meet the highest quality standards serving the residents around us and assist the agricultural demand for water currently needed to support the irrigation needs of food crops grown in our area.

In this way, the City can follow the lead of other proactive communities in our area by taking appropriate action to maximize and protect our most precious resource; and provide for a more sustainable future benefiting every member of our community.

Finally, if the City were to meet the SWRCB guidelines for financial assistance and use available funds to implement improved wastewater treatment technology, recycled water processed by the City of Manteca could be used for food crop application and not limited to cattle fodder crop application. NU urges the RWQCB to consider delaying adoption of the new NPDES WDR requirements prior to issuance of SWRCB guidelines for Proposition 1 funding.

RE: Comments on Basin Plan Amendments to Add a Variance Policy, Salinity Variance Program, and Salinity Exception Program

Dear Ms. Yee:

The City of Manteca (City) appreciates the opportunity to submit comments on the amendments to the *Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento River and San Joaquin River Basins* and the *Water Quality Control Plan for the Tulare Lake Basin* (Basin Plans) to add policies for *Variations from Surface Water Quality Standards for Point Source Dischargers* (Variance Policy), a *Variance Program for Salinity* (Salinity Variance Program), and an *Exception from Implementation of Water Quality Objectives for Salinity* (Salinity Exception Program).

The City owns and operates the Manteca Wastewater Quality Control Facility (WQCF), which provides wastewater treatment services to over 100,000 people in Manteca and the neighboring communities. The City would like to express our support for the amendments to the Basin Plans and to encourage the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) to adopt the Variance Policy, the Salinity Variance Program, and the Salinity Exception Program.

With respect to the Salinity Variance Program and Salinity Exception Program, the City has been active participants in the Central Valley Salinity Alternative for Long-Term Sustainability (CV-SALTS), the Regional Board's planning process for salinity and nutrient management and regulation. While CV-SALTS continues to develop a long-term plan that addresses salinity comprehensively, in the interim period, the City is concerned that the WQCF would have to comply with permit requirements based on the existing water quality objectives for salinity.

The Manteca WQCF discharges high-quality, tertiary-treated effluent to the San Joaquin River in the South Delta region. Prior to mid-2005, the City used groundwater as its sole potable water source. Beginning in July and August 2005, the City began substituting a portion of its potable water supply from groundwater to surface water from the South San Joaquin Irrigation District's South County Surface Water Supply Project. Subsequently, EC levels in the WQCF's effluent decreased significantly. In fact, in recent years we have observed a 25% improvement in EC levels over those seen in 2004-2005.¹ However, despite these significant improvements, the WQCF cannot comply with the current summertime EC water quality objective of 700 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$. The WQCF currently averages 763 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$ during the summer months.²

In addition, analysis has shown that the WQCF's current flows have an insignificant impact on salinity levels in the downstream receiving waters, and further improvements in effluent salinity would have no measurable environmental benefit. Specifically, the Technical Supporting Document for the Variance Policy³ shows that the WQCF's current effluent EC levels result in receiving water EC levels of 431 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$. And, if the WQCF were to lower its effluent EC levels by 63 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$ to comply with the 700 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$ objective, the receiving water EC level would drop to an estimated 430 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$, an improvement of 1 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$. This insignificant improvement in receiving water quality would not justify the treatment facilities needed to lower EC levels nor the financial burden such facilities would place on our community. However, using the new Salinity Variance Policy and allowing the WQCF to discharge at current water quality levels is a reasonable regulatory approach that would not negatively impact the quality of the receiving water.

Furthermore, the water quality objectives upon which the 700 $\mu\text{mhos/cm}$ summertime effluent limits are based are likely to be revised as a result of CV-SALTS or the State Water Resources Control Board's review of the salinity standards in the Bay-Delta Plan. We support the Salinity Variance Program and the Salinity Exception Program because it would provide the Regional Board with a necessary regulatory tool to use in the interim where current objectives may be made irrelevant by other regulatory and planning processes under development.

The City has recently applied for a renewal of its NPDES permit, and we are hopeful that the adoption of the Variance Policy will assist the Regional Water Board in issuing a reasonable permit, one that will be protective of beneficial uses without imposing unnecessary economic hardship on our community. Accordingly, the City encourages



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
