Just FYI, Drew Lehman called me this morning. Here's what we discussed:

- Feather River Organics: if they're going to shut down for this winter, they need to stop accepting more green waste next week. I told him what our 15 July letter said, and he gave me more big-picture hand waving. I said that we really need specific information about why they can't collect more water, and suggested that we have a conference call with his technical folks. He likes that idea and will set up something with Phil and Golder. He also asked how they'll know that they can keep FRO open and I said that we'll be revising the CAO.
- Landfill gas at YSDI- he just sent a note to his folks asking for the information that Todd has asked for.
- YSDI NOV. He asked again that this be rescinded. I said that I think it's appropriate to keep it in place, that we're not treating Recology any different than anyone else, that we had numerous conversations with Recology before issuing it, and that we don't rescind NOVs for other people. He kept pushing and I said that I would not rescind it but that he could talk to Andrew.
- Hay Road CDO. We went over the Hearing Procedures and I explained a number of things. He thought he had to submit something regarding the designated parties by July 18th and was relieved to find that he didn't. We also talked about the July 25th date to give us an indication of whether they'll contest. I suggested that he look at the Hereby Ordered section first. He seemed pretty appreciative of the CDO and the timelines allowed. I don't think they'll contest but they'll probably ask for clarifying language.
- Hay Road CAO- I told him that it will be out in a week or so for a second review/comment cycle. He asked if it would go on the web and I said that this was our standard procedure. We also talked about the fact that we rarely, if ever, get public comment to items on the web but that the agency needs to post these items for transparency. He didn't seem upset about it being posted; he seemed to be just trying to understand our process.
