NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Proposed revisions to Waste Discharge Requirements General Order R5-2013-0120 for Growers within the Tulare Lake Basin Area that are Members of Third-Party Group

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board or Board) has released tentative waste discharge requirements (WDRs) proposing revisions to WDR General Order R5-2013-0120 for growers within the Tulare Lake Basin Area that are Members of a Third-Party Group (TLBA General Order). The proposed revisions to the TLBA General Order allows additional time for owners and/or operators of managed wetlands to obtain membership in an applicable third-party group.

Central Valley Water Board staff (Staff) is proposing the extension of the open enrollment period for owners and operators of managed wetlands to allow for the consideration of alternative regulatory options for discharges from managed wetlands. Staff has hosted multiple managed wetlands workgroup meetings to discuss the range of options for regulatory coverage and presented these options to the Board as an informational item during a special managed wetlands workshop on 15 April 2015 at the San Luis National Wildlife Refuge. The proposed tentative WDRs would extend the open enrollment deadline for managed wetlands by one year while Staff continue to work with stakeholders to develop these regulatory options.

A public hearing concerning the proposed revisions to the TLBA General Order will be held in Rancho Cordova on 10/11 December 2015, at which time the board will consider adoption. The board will only consider adoption of the proposed revisions, and will not be re-considering other aspects of the Order. The hearing date and location are noted below:

The final meeting agenda will be available at http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/centralvalley/board_info/meetings/ at least ten days before the meeting. The agenda will provide the hearing date for the revisions to the TLBA General

Order, indicate the anticipated order of agenda items, include all material related to this agenda item, and may include staff revisions.

Written comments on the proposed revisions to the TLBA General Order must be received at the Central Valley Water Board office or at the email address below by 12 October 2015. Comments on other matters associated with the Order, outside of the scope of the proposed revisions, will not be considered at this hearing. Person's submitting written comments are encouraged to do so electronically by sending them to dsholes@waterboards.ca.gov. Otherwise, written comments may be sent to Attn. David Sholes, 1685 E Street, Fresno, CA 93706. Comments received by 12 October will be included in the administrative record; submitted comments will be considered and a written response will be prepared. Written comments shall not be read into the record unless allowed by the Central Valley Water Board Chair.

At the hearing, staff will present a final recommendation for Central Valley Water Board consideration. Interested persons will be provided the opportunity to present oral comments to the Central Valley Water Board at the hearing. Oral testimony will be limited in time by the Central Valley Water Board Chair. The Chair may, at his discretion, allow presenters to supplement their oral testimony with slides or other digital media. If you plan to use visual aids such as PowerPoint slides, contact staff prior to the meeting to arrange for equipment set-up. You must provide a printed or electronic copy of any visual aids.

Ex Parte Communications. Ex parte communications are allowed in this matter subject to the disclosure requirements of Water Code section 13287. Ex parte communications are prohibited for a period beginning 14 days before the board meeting at which the proposed order is scheduled for board action. For communications concerning any issue in this proceeding, ex parte communications are prohibited starting on 26 November. If the board does not take action on 10/11 December, the ex parte prohibition will remain in place until the board, the Chair or Executive Officer directs otherwise. Once lifted, the prohibition on ex parte communications may be reinstated for 14 days before the day of the board meeting to which the decision is continued. The board will provide notice via the Lyris email list for this item if the prohibition is lifted and/or reinstated.

The procedures governing Central Valley Water Board meetings may be found at Title 23, California Code of Regulations, section 647 et seq. and are available upon request. Hearings before the Central Valley Water Board are not conducted pursuant to Government Code section 11500 et seq.
