NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
(NPDES PERMIT NO. CA000xxx)
FOR
DISCHARGES FROM MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEMS**

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board proposes to adopt a new Region-wide General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit and Waste Discharge Requirements to address discharges from Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) within its regional boundaries. Currently there are seven (7) individual Phase I MS4 permits covering 23 MS4 communities and 120 Phase II MS4 communities enrolled under the State wide MS4 Phase II permit (State Water Board Order WQ 2013-0001-DWQ). The tentative Region-wide General NPDES permit proposes to shift the focus of permit requirements from a level of actions to be implemented by the Permittee to identifying outcomes to be achieved by those actions. This permitting approach, referred to as a water quality focused framework, represents an important paradigm shift in the approach for MS4 permits within the Central Valley region. Any Phase I or II MS4 under the jurisdiction of the Central Valley Water Board may enroll in this Order. Staff recommends the Central Valley Water Board adopt the tentative NPDES permit to regulate MS4 discharges.

A public hearing to consider adoption of the tentative permit will be held during the Central Valley Water Board meeting, which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- Staff of Central Valley Water Board

Designated parties but not interested persons will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Central Valley Water Board staff will prepare the administrative record, and may present evidence, make an oral presentation and cross-examine opposing witnesses.

Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses, and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness

testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 pm on 20 May 2016**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

The tentative Order was issued on 20 **April 2016**. Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 pm on 20 May 2016**. Written materials submitted after this date and time will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from Board members, counsel staff or others, at the discretion of the Board.
