ORDER NO. 84-91

**WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
FOR  
COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE  
TWIN PINES RANCH SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITE  
Southeast of Banning - Riverside County**

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

1. The County of Riverside Probation Department (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), P. O. Box 833, Riverside, California, 92502, submitted current information dated May 7, 1984 to update waste discharge requirements for the existing site.
2. The discharger is discharging nonhazardous wastes in a solid waste disposal site located in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 33, T3S, R2E, SBB&M, as shown on Attachment "A".
3. The discharger operates the site as a trench landfill. The refuse is covered weekly. The site receives approximately 140 cubic yards-per-year of nonhazardous wastes consisting primarily of paper and empty food containers. Food wastes are ground in a garbage disposal and discharged into the ranch septic tank/leachfield system.
4. The estimated remaining life of the site is from two to three years. Total site area is 0.50 acres.
5. The disposal area is near the top of a small knoll, situated  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile from Ditch Creek, and Twin Pines Creek which are both intermittent streams. There is sufficient capacity in the channels to contain flows from a 100 year storm without inundation of the disposal site.
6. The site is located on the northern flanks of the San Jacinto Mountains in Cretaceous granitic rocks. Ground water levels are approximately 60 feet. Ground water flow is primarily through fractures. This finding is general because of the lack of wells in the area.
7. The beneficial uses of ground water in the San Gorgonio Hydrologic Subunit are:
  - a. Municipal supply
  - b. Agricultural supply
  - c. Industrial supply
8. Land within 1,000 feet of this site is used as pasture for cattle.

9. The Water Quality Control Plan for the Colorado River Basin Region of California was adopted by the Regional Board on May 16, 1984. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the San Gorgonio Hydrologic Subunit, and this Order implements those objectives.
10. This disposal site meets the criteria contained in the California Administrative Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter 15, for classification as a Class III landfill suitable to receive nonhazardous solid waste.
11. This discharge has been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 77-96.
12. The Board has notified the discharger and interested persons and agencies of its intent to update waste discharge requirements for this site.
13. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the existing discharge.
14. The disposal site constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et. seq.), and State guidelines because the governmental approvals on or after April 15, 1973, do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such activity than the governmental approvals received prior to that date.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications

1. The treatment or disposal of wastes shall not cause pollution or a nuisance as defined in Sections 13050 (l) and 13050 (m) of the California Water Code.
2. Waste materials shall not be discharged or allowed to be blown outside the designated disposal area shown on Attachment "A".
3. Surface drainage from tributary areas and internal site drainage from surface or subsurface sources shall not contact or percolate through wastes discharged at this site.
4. Wastes shall not be discharged on any surface which is less than five feet above the highest anticipated ground water level.
5. Wastes shall not be placed in ponded water from any source whatsoever.
6. There shall be no discharge of liquids unless approved by the Executive Officer.
7. The disposal area shall be protected from any washout or erosion of wastes or covering material and from any inundation which could occur as a result of floods having a predicted frequency of once in 100 years.

8. The exterior surfaces of the disposal area shall be graded to promote lateral runoff of precipitation and to prevent ponding.

9. The discharger shall remove and relocate any wastes which are discharged at this site in violation of these requirements.

B. Prohibitions

1. The discharge of wastes to any surface drainage course is prohibited.

2. Hazardous wastes shall not be discharged at this site.

C. Provisions

1. The discharger shall file an updated operation plan with this Board when substantial changes in operations have been made. For the purpose of these requirements, this includes any proposed change in the boundaries or contours of the site. A letter indicating conformance with existing plans and requirements shall be submitted annually. Said plan shall be pursuant to the California Administrative Code, Title 23, Subchapter 15, Section 2596.

2. The discharger shall file a Site Closure and Maintenance Report with this Board pursuant to California Administrative Code, Title 23, Subchapter 15, Section 2597.

3. The discharger shall comply with "Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 84-91", and future revisions thereto, as specified by the Executive Officer.

4. The discharger shall maintain monuments identifying the limits of the disposal site and of each solid waste disposal area within the site.

5. The discharger shall maintain a copy of this Order available at all times to site operating personnel.

6. This Board considers the property owner to have a continuing responsibility for correcting any problems which may arise in the future as a result of waste discharge or water applied to this property during subsequent use of the land for other purposes. In the event of any change in ownership of the disposal site, or change of operations, the discharger shall:

a. Notify this Board of such a change; and

b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator of the existence of this Order by letter; a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.

7. This Order supersedes this Board Order No. 77-96.

2. Any discharge of wastes other than those allowed in the specifications	Type, volume and exact location	Immediately upon becoming aware that the waste has been discharged

Quarterly monitoring reports shall be submitted to the Regional Board by January 15, April 15, July 15, and October 15 of each year.


