Looking Ahead

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Transitioning ELAP

- As we become a better program, we have more insight to how the laboratories are performing
 - ▶ I'll speak to that in the next few slides
- We are recognizing where the deficiencies are and our focus is shifting from internal to external improvements
- Our job is not only to regulate, but to partner with the laboratory community to help them perform well
 - We are now in a better position to provide assistance

Quantifying Laboratory Performance

- Results from on-site assessments
- Proficiency testing evaluation results
- Enforcement actions

Results from On-Site Assessments

- We are concerned about the deficiencies found in the training assessments
 - > 70% of the drinking water labs assessed are not performing at a level we are comfortable with
- We suspect wastewater and hazardous waste laboratories are in the same condition
- We have some ideas to help them

Proficiency Testing Evaluation Results

- A result of creating the PT Unit is that now we have a clearer picture of compliance with current PT requirements
- > 74% of laboratories have at least one deficiency
 - Obtained an unacceptable evaluation (approximately 5%)
 - Did not participate in a PT study (approximately 47.5%)
 - Made errors in reporting PT study results (approximately 47.5%)
- Some deficiencies should improve as laboratories implement or improve their management system
 - Particularly deficiencies in misreporting and not performing required tests

Enforcement Actions

- Our enforcement unit has been busier than anticipated
 - We've found that some laboratories do not know requirements
 - Others intentionally do not follow requirements

Ideas for Laboratory Improvement

- Technical training series for laboratory directors and quality assurance officers
- Dedicated compliance assistance staff
- Extension on training assessment contract

Technical Training Series

- For laboratory directors and quality assurance officers
 - They are responsible for all laboratory operations and the data produced
- Focus on the technical aspects of managing a laboratory
 - Regulatory and analytical method requirements
 - Instruction on instrumentation
 - Management of systems and staff
 - Good laboratory practices
- This will be designed to address the serious findings from the training assessments

Dedicated Laboratory Assistance Staff

- ► Technical assistance and consultation is not one of ELAP's core functions
- We would like to dedicate position(s) to development and implement a compliance assistance program
 - ▶ To address this urgent problem
- Short-term need
- The compliance program would focus on improving underperforming laboratories

Extension on Current Assessment Contract

- NV5/Dade Moeller is only assessing drinking water labs
 - ▶ ELAP doesn't have the expertise or staff resources and we see this as urgent
- We would like the experts to assess all laboratories once
- ► ELAP will perform follow-up "verification" on-site assessments to ensure underperforming laboratories have corrected deficiencies and are on the right path
