Dear Mr. Willard:

On March 9, 2015, the State Water Resources Control Board – Division of Drinking Water (Division) issued Compliance Order Amendment No. 03-23-15RA-001 (enclosed) to the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System (Water System). This amendment adds to and revises the directives of Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006, issued to the Water System on May 1, 2012, for non-compliance with the Surface Water Treatment Rule.

The Amendment requires your water system to present to the Division a Corrective Action Plan for improvements to the water system to correct the water quality problem (violation of the Surface Water Treatment Rule) and eliminate the need to deliver water to customers that does not meet primary drinking water standards. The amended Compliance Order also requires that the water system comply with California Health and Safety Code, Section 116555, and California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Sections 64652, 64653, and 64654, by no later than **December 31, 2016**.

Please note that Division approval is required before proceeding with any changes or additions to your treatment or source of supply.

Directive No. C-2 requires that the Corrective Action Plan be presented to the Division in an Office Meeting no later than **May 30, 2015**. Arrangements for presenting the plan can be made by contacting Philip Dutton or myself at (559) 447-3300.

Since this is an enforcement action for noncompliance with state regulations, the water system will be billed at the Division's current hourly rate for this action.

15 The State Water Resources Control Board (hereinafter "Board"), acting by and through its
16 Division of Drinking Water (hereinafter "Division") and the Deputy Director for the
17 Division (hereinafter "Deputy Director"), hereby issues this Compliance Order
18 Amendment No. 03-23-15RA-001 to Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006 (hereinafter
19 "Amendment").
20

21
22 The Board, successor in interest to the California Department of Public Health, issued
23 Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006 (hereinafter "Compliance Order"), provided as
24 Attachment A to this amendment, to the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System
25 (hereinafter "Water System") on or about May 1, 2012.
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The Board hereby amends the Compliance Order as follows:

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A) Delete Order 2 and replace with the following:

“Prepare a Corrective Action Plan, for Division approval, identifying improvements to the Water System designed to correct the water quality problem (violation of the Surface Water Treatment Rule) and ensure that the Water System delivers water to consumers that meets primary drinking water standards. The plan shall include a time schedule for completion of each of the phases of the project such as alternatives evaluation and selection, design, construction, permitting, and startup. The Water System shall include a plan for financing the necessary improvements and any increases in the operation and maintenance costs.”

B) Delete Order 3 and replace with the following:

“Effective immediately, and each calendar quarter thereafter, the Water System shall provide notice to all users, in English and Spanish, notifying them to boil their water for drinking and cooking. The Water System shall immediately distribute the Boil Water Order, provided as Attachment A to the Compliance Order. The Boil Water Order shall be in place until such a time that a Division-approved disinfection treatment is activated and achieves 4-log virus inactivation, as required under Directive No. 4 of this Compliance Order. Upon installation of the disinfection treatment required under Directive No. 4, and with Division approval, the Boil Water Order may be rescinded.

1 The Water System shall provide proof that the Boil Water Order has been
2 disseminated to all users, to the Division by **March 31, 2015**, and by the end of
3 each calendar quarter thereafter. A copy of the form to provide proof of notification
4 is provided as Attachment B of the Compliance Order.”

7 C) Delete Order 3 and replace with the following:

8 “On or before **April 30, 2015**, submit a written response to the Division indicating
9 its agreement to comply with the directives of the Compliance Order and this
10 amendment.”
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13 D) The Water System is further directed as follows:

14 **DIRECTIVES**

15 C-1: On or before **December 31, 2016**, comply with California Health and Safety
16 Code, Section 116555, and California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Sections
17 64652, 64653, and 64654.
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19 C-2: On or before **May 30, 2015**, present the Corrective Action Plan, required
20 under Order 2 above, to the Division’s Fresno District Office in an office meeting.
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23 Except as amended herein, all other terms of Compliance Order No. 03-23-12O-006 shall
24 remain in full force and effect.

COMPLIANCE ORDER FOR NONCOMPLIANCE
WITH THE SURFACE WATER TREATMENT RULE

Issued on May 1, 2012

Section 116655, Chapter 4 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the issuance of an Order for failure to comply with a requirement of the California Safe Drinking Water Act, or any regulation, standard, permit, or order issued thereunder.

FINDINGS

The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System (hereinafter 'Water System') is a community water system located in Fresno County that supplies domestic water to



1 approximately 33 permanent residents through 18 service connections. The Water System
2 currently operates under a domestic water supply permit issued by the Fresno County
3 Department of Health (hereinafter 'County') on May 14, 1985. As of September 1, 2007,
4 the County transferred the jurisdiction for regulatory oversight of this water system to the
5 California Department of Public Health - Drinking Water Program (hereinafter
6 'Department').
7

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9 The Water System utilizes water from a single well, with no treatment, as the sole source
10 of water supply. Use of Well 01 was approved via the 1985 County issued permit. In a
11 Water System Evaluation and Inspection Report dated January 12, 2011, the Department
12 identified concerns regarding the construction and location of Well 01. Specifically, the
13 Department recognized well and site characteristics that may indicate that Well 01
14 produces groundwater under the direct influence of surface water (hereinafter 'GWUDI').
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18 Well 01 was constructed in 1984 by Johnson Drilling Company, using the casing hammer
19 method. The well was installed through cobble stone to 30 feet and broken schist rock
20 through the remaining depth. The well was constructed with a 33 foot annular seal, which
21 does not satisfy the minimum 50 foot requirements of the California Waterworks
22 Standards. The length from 33 feet through the remaining depth of 400 feet is an open bore
23 hole. Well 01 is located between the primary channel of the Kings River and a seasonal
24 stream. Both water bodies are approximately 150 feet from the well. The Department has
25 deemed Well 01 to be GWUDI.
26
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1 California Code of Regulations (hereinafter 'CCR'), Section 64651.10 defines approved
2 surface water as either surface water or GWUDI that has received permit approval in
3 accordance with California Health and Safety Code (hereinafter 'CHSC'), Sections 116525
4 through 116550.
5

6
7 CCR Section 64652(a) specifies that each supplier using an approved surface water source
8 shall provide multibarrier treatment that meets the requirements of the Surface Water
9 Treatment Rule (hereinafter 'SWTR') and reliably ensures that at least a total of 99.9
10 percent (3.0-log) reduction of *Giardia* cysts and 99.99 percent (4.0-log) reduction of
11 viruses is achieved through filtration and disinfection.
12

13
14 CCR Section 64653(a) specifies that all approved surface water utilized by a supplier shall
15 be treated using conventional filtration, direct filtration, diatomaceous earth filtration or
16 slow sand filtration unless an alternative process has been approved by the Department,
17 pursuant to subsections (f), (g) and (h).
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19
20 CCR Section 64654(a) requires that all approved surface water utilized by a supplier shall
21 be provided with continuous disinfection treatment sufficient to insure that the total
22 treatment process provides inactivation of *Giardia lamblia* cysts and viruses, in
23 conjunction with the removals obtained through filtration, to meet the reduction
24 requirements specified in Section 64652(a).
25
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1 CCR Section 64666(a) requires a surface water system to notify its consumers whenever
2 there is a failure to comply with the treatment requirements specified in Sections 64652,
3 64653 and 64654. The public notification format for violations of Sections 64652, 65653
4 and 64654 of the SWTR is included in Attachment A. Proof of Public Notification
5 (Attachment B) must be submitted to the Department within ten (10) days of disseminating
6 Attachment A.
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8

9 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**
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12 Based on the above Findings, the Department has determined that the Doyal's Mobile
13 Home Park Water System has violated provisions contained in Title 22, California Code of
14 Regulations (CCR) and in the California Health and Safety Code (CHSC). These violations
15 include, but are not limited to the following:
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- 17
- 18 1. CHSC Section 116555(a)(3): Specifically, the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water
19 System has failed to ensure that a reliable and adequate supply of pure, wholesome,
20 healthful, and potable water is provided to all of its consumers.
21
 - 22 2. CCR Section 64652(a): The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System has failed to
23 provide multibarrier treatment that meets the requirements of the SWTR and
24 reliably ensures that at least a total of 99.9 percent (3.0-log) reduction of *Giardia*
25 cysts and 99.99 percent (4.0-log) reduction of virus is achieved through filtration
26 and disinfection.
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3 3. CCR Section 64653(a): The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System has failed to
4 treat the approved surface water using conventional filtration, direct filtration,
5 diatomaceous earth filtration, slow sand filtration, or an alternative process
6 approved by the Department pursuant to sections 64653(a), (f), (g) and (h).
7

8 4. CCR Section 64654(a) and 64654(b)(1): The Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water
9 System has failed to provide continuous disinfection treatment and hence has failed
10 to provide the necessary pathogen inactivation and to maintain a detectable chlorine
11 residual of 0.2 mg/l or greater in the distribution system pursuant to section
12 64654(a) and (b) (1).
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15 **ORDER**
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18 In order to ensure that the water supplied by the Water System is at all times safe,
19 wholesome, healthful, and potable, and pursuant to Section 116655 of the Health and
20 Safety Code, Doyal's Mobile Home Park is ordered to take the following actions:
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- 22 1. Cease and Desist from failing to comply with Title 22, CCR Sections 64652,
23 64653, 64654, and CHSC Section 116555.
24
25 2. By July 31, 2012, the Doyal's Mobile Home Park Water System shall submit to the
26 Department, for review and approval, a plan for improvements to provide an
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1 alternate source of potable water or to comply with all SWTR requirements and
2 eliminate the need to deliver water to consumers that does not meet the treatment
3 requirements as specified under the SWTR. The plan shall include a time schedule
4 for completion of various phases of the project such as evaluation of alternatives,
5 selection of project, design and construction and startup.
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8 3. Effective immediately, the Water System shall provide notice to all users, in
9 English and Spanish, notifying them to boil their water for drinking and cooking.
10 The Water System shall immediately distribute the Boil Water Order, provided as
11 Attachment A. The Boil Water Order shall be in place until such a time that a
12 department-approved disinfection treatment is activated and achieves 4-log virus
13 inactivation, as required under Directive No. 4 of this Order. Upon installation of
14 the disinfection treatment required under Order No. 4 below, the Boil Water Order
15 may be rescinded. The Water System shall provide proof that the Boil Water Order
16 has been disseminated to all users, to the Department by May 4, 2012. A copy of a
17 form to provide proof of notification is included as Attachment B. Should the
18 Water System not submit the required proof of dissemination by the required
19 deadline, the Department may distribute the Boil Water Order to the Water
20 System's customers.
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25 4. Until a permanent solution is completed, the Water System shall provide 4-log
26 virus inactivation through continuous disinfection of the Well 01. The Department
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1 will provide the Water System with the permitting requirements, necessary before
2 activation of any treatment or change in source, via a subsequent correspondence.
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5 5. The plans for the chlorination system shall be approved by the Department prior to
6 any installation of equipment. The design and installation shall be completed by an
7 individual certified, at a minimum, as a T2 or D2 operator.
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10 6. The Water System shall thereafter provide ongoing public notification to all
11 customers notifying them of the failure to comply with the SWTR by continuously
12 posting a notice in conspicuous locations and by direct delivery to each resident. The
13 first notice should be provided by **May 20, 2012** informing users that the water does
14 not meet the filtration and disinfection treatment requirements of the SWTR. The
15 English version of the public notification is included in Attachment C. The Water
16 System shall provide proof of publication of the notification to the Department by
17 **May 30, 2012**. A copy of this form is included as Attachment D.
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20 7. The Water System shall repeat public notification to all residents using Attachment
21 C by direct delivery until a project is completed to correct the problem. Proof of
22 public notification, using Attachment D, shall be submitted to the Department by the
23 10th day of the month following the issuance of the notice each calendar quarter.
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26 8. The Water System shall submit quarterly progress reports to the Department, with
27 the first progress report due on **September 30, 2012**. The quarterly reports shall



1 discuss the progress the Water System has made to comply with the SWTR
2 filtration and disinfection requirements.
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5 9. The Water System shall maintain, at a minimum, a T1 and D1 certified operator, in
6 accordance with Enforcement Letter No. 03-23-12E-008, issued by the Department
7 on January 30, 2012, for failure to maintain an appropriately certified operator. The
8 T1 certified treatment operator shall provide operational oversight and control of
9 the disinfection treatment required under Directive No. 4 of this Order.
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12 10. The Water System shall submit a written response by May 11, 2012, indicating its
13 willingness to comply with the directives of this Compliance Order.
14

15 12. The Department reserves the right to make such modifications to this Order as it
16 may deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modifications may be
17 issued as amendments to this Order and shall be effective upon issuance.

1 14. If the Water System is unable to perform the tasks specified in this Order for any
2 reason, whether within or beyond its control, and if the Water System notifies the
3 Department in writing no less than five days in advance of the due date, the
4 Department may extend the time for performance if the Water System demonstrates
5 that it has used its best efforts to comply with the schedule and other requirements
6 of this Order.
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9 15. If the Water System fails to perform any of the tasks specified in this Order by the
10 time described herein or by the time subsequently extended pursuant to Item 14
11 above, Water System shall be deemed to have not complied with the obligations of
12 this Order and may be subject to additional judicial action, including civil penalties
13 specified in II&S Code, Section 116725 and 116730.
14

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16 16. The State of California shall not be liable for any injuries or damages to persons or
17 property resulting from acts of omissions by the Water System, its employees,
18 agents, or contractors in carrying out activities pursuant to this Order, nor shall the
19 State of California be held as a party to any contract entered into by the Water
20 System or its agents in carrying out activities pursuant to this Order.
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23 **PARTIES BOUND**
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25 This Order shall apply to and be binding upon the Doyal's Mobile Home Park water
26 system, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, successors, and assignees.
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


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SEVERABILITY


The requirements of this Order are severable, and the Doyal's Mobile Home Park shall comply with each and every provision thereof notwithstanding the effectiveness of any provisions.

BOIL WATER ORDER

Este informe contiene información importante sobre su agua potable.

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Failure to follow this advisory could result in stomach or intestinal illness.

The well serving the Doyal's Mobile Home Park has been deemed groundwater under the direct influence of surface water and requires treatment that is not currently provided. Additionally, management has not conducted the required bacteriological water quality monitoring necessary to ensure that your water is safe. The California Department of Public Health is advising all users of the Doyal's Mobile Home Park water system to use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution.

Doyal's Mobile Home Park has been required to provide full treatment of the well water or find a replacement source of supply. Until a permanent solution has been identified, Doyal's Mobile Home Park will be required to provide adequate chlorine disinfection of the well water. This Boil Water Order will remain in place until the disinfection is installed.

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a boil, **let it boil for one (1) minute**, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking and food preparation **until further notice**. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. This is the preferred method to assure that the water is safe to drink. An alternative method of purification is to use fresh liquid household bleach (Clorox, Purex, etc.). To do so, add 8 drops (or 1/4 teaspoon) of bleach per gallon of clear water or 16 drops (or 1/2 teaspoon) per gallon of cloudy water; mix thoroughly, and allow to stand for 30 minutes before using. A chlorine-like taste and odor will result from this purification procedure and is an indication that adequate disinfection has taken place.

You will be notified when you no longer need to boil your water.

Este informe contiene información muy importante sobre su agua potable.

HERVIR EL AGUA ANTES DE USAR

No seguir este asesor podría provocar en el estomago o enfermedad intestinal.

El pozo que sirve Mobile Home Park de Doyal ha sido considerada subterránea bajo la influencia directa de agua superficial y requiere un tratamiento que no está previsto actualmente. Además, la administración no realizó la calidad bacteriológica del agua necesaria supervisión necesarias para garantizar que el agua es segura. El departamento de salud pública de California es asesorar a todos los usuarios del sistema de agua de Mobile Home Park de Doyal utilizar agua del grifo hervida o agua embotellada para beber y cocinar con fines como una medida de seguridad.

Mobile Home Park del Doyal ha sido requerido para proporcionar un tratamiento completo del agua de pozo o encontrar una fuente de sustitución de la oferta. Hasta una solución permanente ha sido identificada, será necesario proporcionar desinfección adecuadas de cloro del agua de pozo de Mobile Home Park del Doyal. Este pedido de agua hierva permanecerán en vigor hasta que se instale la desinfección.

NO BEBER EL AGUA SIN HERVIR PRIMERO. Llevar a ebullición a toda el agua, dejarla hervir un 1 minuto y dejar enfriar antes de usar o usar agua embotellada. Agua hervida o embotellada debe utilizarse para la preparación de alimentos y beber hasta nuevo aviso. Punto de ebullición mata a las bacterias y otros organismos en el agua. Este es el método preferido para asegurar que el agua es seguro para beber. Un método alternativo de purificación es utilizar fresco blanqueador doméstico líquido (Chlorox, Purex, etc.). Para hacerlo, agregue 8 gotas (o 1/4 de cucharadita) de blanqueador por galón de agua clara o 16 gotas (o 1/2 cucharadita) por cada galón de agua turbia, homogeneizar y dejar para reposar durante 30 minutos antes de usar. Un olor y sabor de cloro-como serán el resultado de este procedimiento de purificación y es una indicación de que ha producido la desinfección adecuada.

Se le notificará cuando ya no necesite a hervir el agua.

Doyal's Mobile Home Park water system**Does Not Meet Filtration and Disinfection Treatment Requirements**

Our water system uses groundwater under the direct influence of surface water (GWUDI) as the source of water supply. Drinking water regulations require GWUDI sources to have complete multibarrier treatment, including filtration and disinfection. The water must meet all drinking water requirements, including those for treatment of the GWUDI source. Because no treatment is currently provided, the Water System has violated Surface Water Treatment Rule (SWTR). Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

"In order to ensure proper treatment under SWTR, water must be provided multi-barrier treatment via CDPH-approved filtration and disinfection techniques."

What should I do?

- This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. We have not conducted the required bacteriological water quality monitoring in five of the past six months.
- *Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites that can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.* These symptoms, however, are not caused only by organisms in drinking water, but also by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.
- A home filter will not necessarily solve the problem because not all home filters protect against parasites.
