CITATION FOR NON-COMPLIANCE

Sections 64432, 64432.1, 64432.3, 64442, 64445.1 and 64449

Title 22, California Code of Regulations

Chemical Monitoring and Reporting Violation

Chapter 4, Article 9, Section 116650 of Part 12 of Division 104 of the California Health and Safety Code (CHSC), authorizes the issuance of a citation for failure to comply with a requirement of Chapter 4 (California Safe Drinking Water Act), or any regulation, standard, permit or order issued thereunder.

The Division of Drinking Water and Environmental Management of the California Department of Public Health (Department) hereby issues a citation to Yokayo Water

1 System (System) for failure to comply with Title 22, California Code of Regulations
2 (CCR) Section(s) 64432, 64432.1, 64432.3, 64442, 64445.1 and 64449.

3
4 **APPLICABLE AUTHORITIES**

5 Section 116650 of the CHSC states in relevant part:

- 6
- 7 (a) If the department determines that a public water system is in violation of this
8 chapter or any regulation, permit, standard, citation, or order issued or
9 adopted thereunder, the department may issue a citation to the public water
10 system. The citation shall be served upon the public water system
11 personally or by certified mail. Service shall be deemed effective as of the
12 date of personal service or the date of receipt of the certified mail. If a
13 person to whom a citation is directed refuses to accept delivery of the
14 certified mail, the date of service shall be deemed to be the date of mailing.
- 15
- 16 (b) Each citation shall be in writing and shall describe the nature of the violation
17 or violations, including a reference to the statutory provision, standard,
18 order, citation, permit, or regulation alleged to have been violated.
- 19
- 20 (c) A citation may specify a date for elimination or correction of the condition
21 constituting the violation.
- 22
- 23 (d) A citation may include the assessment of a penalty as specified in
24 subdivision (e).
- 25
- 26 (e) The department may assess a penalty in an amount not to exceed one
27 thousand dollars (\$1,000) per day for each day that a violation occurred,

1 and for each day that a violation continues to occur. A separate penalty
2 may be assessed for each violation.
3

4 California Code of Regulations Section 64432 states in relevant part:
5

6 Unless more frequent monitoring is required pursuant to this Chapter, the
7 frequency of monitoring for the inorganic chemicals listed in Table 64431-A,
8 except for asbestos, nitrate/nitrite, and perchlorate, shall be as follows:
9

10 Each compliance period, all community and nontransient-noncommunity systems
11 using groundwater shall monitor once during the year designated by the
12 Department.
13

14 California Code of Regulations Section 64432.1(a) states in relevant part:
15

16 To determine compliance with the MCL for nitrate in Table 64431-A, all public
17 water systems using groundwater and transient-noncommunity systems using
18 approved surface water shall monitor annually, and all community and
19 nontransient-noncommunity systems using approved surface water shall monitor
20 quarterly.
21

22 California Code of Regulations Section 64432.1(b)(3) states in relevant part:
23

24 The repeat monitoring frequency for systems with an analytical result for nitrite
25 that is less than 50 percent of the MCL shall be one sample during each
26 compliance period (every three years).
27

1 California Code of Regulations Section 64432.3(c) states in relevant part:

2 After meeting the initial monitoring requirements in subsection (a) and if no
3 perchlorate is detected, during each compliance period each water system:

4 (1) Using groundwater, shall monitor once during the year designated by the
5 Department.

6
7 California Code of Regulations Section 64442(d)(4)(A) states in relevant part:

8
9 (d) After initial monitoring, each system shall monitor for each radionuclide at
10 each sampling site at a frequency determined by the monitoring results(s) [single
11 sample or average sample results if more than one sample collected] from the
12 most recent compliance period as follows:

13 (4) if the single sample result or average is:

14 A. Below the DLR, the system shall collect and analyze at least one sample
15 every nine years (3 compliance periods).

16
17 California Code of Regulations Section 64445.1(b) states in relevant part:

19 (b) When organic chemicals are not detected pursuant to Table 64445.1-A.

20 (1) A water system which has not detected any of the VOCs on Table 64444-A
21 during the initial four quarters of monitoring, shall collect and analyze one sample
22 annually. After a minimum of three years of annual sampling with no detection of
23 a VOC in Table 64444-A, a system using groundwater may reduce the
24 monitoring frequency to one sample during each compliance period. A system
25 using surface water shall continue monitoring annually.

1 (3) A system serving 3,300 persons or less which has not detected an SOC on
2 Table 64444-A during the initial four quarters of monitoring shall collect a
3 minimum of one sample for that SOC during the year designated by the
4 Department of each subsequent compliance period. The year will be designated
5 on the basis of historical monitoring frequency and laboratory capacity.
6

7 California Code of Regulations Section 64449(b) states in relevant part:

8 Each community water system shall monitor its groundwater sources or
9 distribution system entry points representative of the effluent of source treatment
10 every three years and its approved surface water sources or distribution system
11 entry points representative of the effluent of source treatment annually for the
12 following:

- 13 (1) Secondary MCLs listed in Tables 64449-A and 64449-B; and
- 14 (2) Bicarbonate, carbonate, and hydroxide alkalinity, calcium, magnesium,
15 sodium, pH, and total hardness.
16

17 California Code of Regulations Section 64469 states in relevant part:

18 (a) Analytical results of all sample analyses completed in a calendar month shall
19 be reported to the Department no later than the tenth day of the following month.

20 (b) Analytical results of all sample analyses completed by water wholesalers in a
21 calendar month shall be reported to retail customers and the Department no later
22 than the tenth day of the following month.

23 (c) Analytical results shall be reported to the Department electronically using the
24 Electronic Deliverable Format as defined in The Electronic Deliverable Format
25 [EDF] Version 1.2i Guidelines & Restrictions dated April 2001 and Data
26 Dictionary dated April 2001.
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STATEMENT OF FACTS

To date, the Department has not received laboratory results for the chemical constituents at the specified frequency contained in Attachment A. Specifically, Yokayo Water System is required to monitor in accordance with Sections 64432, 64432.1, 64432.3, 64442, 64445.1, and 64449. The last reported samples reported to the Department are described in Attachment A.

DETERMINATIONS

The Department determined that Yokayo Water System is in violation of Title 22, CCR, Sections 64432, 64432.1, 64432.3, 64442, 64445.1, and 64449. Specifically, the System failed to perform the chemical monitoring described in Attachment A.

Section 64469, Title 22 of the CCR requires that analytical results of all sample analyses completed in a calendar month must be reported to the Department no later than the tenth day of the following month. Analytical results shall be reported to the Department electronically by the laboratory.

DIRECTIVES

Yokayo Water System is hereby directed to take the following actions:

1. Comply with Sections 64432, 64432.1, 64432.3, 64442, 64445.1, 64449, and 64469 in all future monitoring periods.

1 2. Complete all overdue monitoring from sources and regulated constituents given
2 in Attachment A by **January 17, 2014** and have the analyzing laboratory transmit
3 the results to the Department via electronic data transfer by **March 1, 2014**.

4
5 3. Notify all persons served by the System of the source chemical monitoring
6 violation(s) in conformance with Section 64463.4 and Section 64465, Title 22 of
7 the CCR. Notification must be completed in accordance with each of the
8 following:

9 a. Completion of Attachment B to include the name, address and telephone
10 number of a System official as a source of additional information
11 concerning the public notice. Submit a copy of the public notice prior to
12 distribution to the Department for review and approval. **You must also**
13 **give a legible, written description (preferably typed) of the corrective**
14 **actions taken by the System to prevent this violation from occurring**
15 **in the future. You must use the space provided on page 2 of**
16 **Attachment B for this written description.**

17
18 b. By mail or direct delivery of the notice contained in Attachment A, **after it**
19 **has been completed in accordance with (a) above**, to each customer
20 served directly by the water system. This notice must also be given to all
21 other service connections which receive water from the System. This
22 notice must be delivered to each customer/service connection by **January**
23 **17, 2014**.

24
25 c. By posting of the notice contained in Attachment B, **after it has been**
26 **completed in accordance with (a) above**, in conspicuous locations
27

1 throughout the area served by the System. This notice must be posted no
2 later than **January 17, 2014**.

3
4 d. The System shall provide public notice for this violation in accordance with
5 Section 64465(c), Title 22 of the CCR. This section requires that each
6 public notice given pursuant to this article shall contain information in
7 Spanish regarding the importance of the notice, or contain a telephone
8 number or address where Spanish speaking residents may contact the
9 System to obtain a translated copy of the public notice or assistance in
10 Spanish. In addition, Section 64465(c) also requires for each non-English
11 speaking group that exceeds 1,000 residents or 10% of the residents in
12 the community (whichever is less), the public notice must contain
13 information in the appropriate language(s) regarding the importance of the
14 notice, or it must contain a telephone number or address where such
15 residents may contact the System to receive a translated copy of the
16 notice or to receive assistance in the appropriate language. The Spanish
17 language requirement is already included in the notice attached to this
18 citation, Attachment A.

19
20 4. A representative of the System shall complete the attached Certification of
21 Compliance form and return it to the Department by **January 30, 2014**. A copy
22 of the notice delivered to customers and a copy of the posting must be attached
23 to the Compliance Certification Form.

24
25 All documents required by this Citation shall be submitted to the Department at the

The Department reserves the right to make such modifications to this Citation, as it deems necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modifications may be issued as amendments to this Citation and shall be effective upon issuance.

PARTIES BOUND

This Citation shall apply to and be binding upon the System, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, successors and assignees.

SEVERABILITY

The directives of this Citation are severable, and the System shall comply with each and every provision thereof notwithstanding the effectiveness of any provision.

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FURTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION

Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4, (commencing with Section 116270) of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the Department to: issue additional citations with assessment of penalties if the System continues to fail to correct a violation identified in a citation; take action to suspend or revoke a permit that has been issued to a public water system if the System has violated applicable laws or regulations or has failed to comply with orders of the Department; and petition the superior court to take various enforcement measures against a public water system that has failed to comply with orders of the Department. The Department does not waive any further enforcement action by issuance of this citation.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

MONITORING REQUIREMENTS NOT MET FOR YOKAYO WATER SYSTEM

Our water system failed to monitor for drinking water standards for inorganic chemicals, nitrate, nitrite, aesthetic related chemicals, volatile organic chemicals, and synthetic organic chemicals as required by the California Code of Regulations. A complete list of chemicals for which we failed to monitor may be obtained by contacting the person given at the bottom of this notice.

Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did to correct the situation. Please share this information with other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly. You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or giving out copies by hand or mail.

What should I do?

Contact your tribal representatives to discuss ways to ensure this monitoring is completed on a timely basis. If you have health concerns, you may wish to consult your doctor. General guidelines on regulated contaminants in drinking water are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

What happened?

We are required by state regulations to monitor our drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of this routine monitoring are an indicator of whether or not the drinking water meets health standards. We did not test for the required chemical constituents and, therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of the drinking water at that time.

What does this mean?

Some people who drink water containing primary inorganic contaminants in excess of the maximum contaminant level over many years may experience health effects ranging from short-term gastrointestinal tract effects and increase in blood pressure to cancer, liver or kidney damage, and heart effects. Although secondary contaminants do not have related health risks, aesthetic issues such as taste, odor, and color may result in water that exceeds the maximum contaminant level for secondary standards. Some people who drink water containing volatile organic chemicals in excess of the maximum contaminant level over many years may experience health effects ranging from nervous system or respiratory problems to cancer, liver or kidney damage, and immune system problems. Some people who drink water containing synthetic organic chemicals in excess of the maximum contaminant level over many years may experience health effects ranging from reproductive difficulties to cancer, liver or kidney damage, and adrenal gland, spleen, and stomach problems. Some people who use water containing methyl-tert-butyl ether (MTBE) in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of getting cancer. Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrite in excess of the maximum contaminant level may become seriously ill and, if

untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blueness of the skin. Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the maximum level allowed by the regulations may quickly become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die because high nitrate levels can interfere with the capacity of the infant's blood to carry oxygen. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blueness of the skin. High nitrate levels may also affect the oxygen-carrying ability of the blood of pregnant women.

Yokayo Water System has not monitored for these chemicals in accordance with the required frequencies and therefore the water quality with respect to these chemicals is unknown at this time.

What corrective actions have been taken?
