In accordance with Section 116577, the Water System will be billed for the preparation and issuance of this citation.

**CITATION FOR NONCOMPLIANCE
With Title 22 California Code of Regulations
Section 64426.1(b)**

Section 116650 of the California Health and Safety Code (CHSC) authorizes the issuance of a citation for failure to comply with a requirement of the California Safe Drinking Water Act (CHSC, Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4, commencing with Section 116270), or any regulation, standard, permit, or order issued thereunder.

1 The State Water Resources Control Board (hereinafter "State Board"), acting by and
2 through its Division of Drinking Water (hereinafter "Division") and the Deputy Director
3 for the Division, hereby issues a citation to Barry Elementary School for failure to
4 comply with Section 64426.1 (b), Title 22, of the California Code of Regulations
5 (CCR).

6
7 **APPLICABLE AUTHORITIES**

8 Section 116650 of the CHSC states:

9
10 *(a) If the Department determines that a public water system is in*
11 *violation of this chapter or any regulation, permit, standard, citation,*
12 *or order issued or adopted thereunder, the department may issue a*
13 *citation to the public water system. The citation shall be served*
14 *upon the public water system personally or by certified mail. Service*
15 *shall be deemed effective as of the date of personal service or the*
16 *date of receipt of the certified mail. If a person to whom a citation is*
17 *directed refuses to accept delivery of the certified mail, the date of*
18 *service shall be deemed to be the date of mailing.*

19
20 *(b) Each citation shall be in writing and shall describe the nature of the*
21 *violation or violations, including a reference to the statutory*
22 *provision, standard, order, citation, permit, or regulation alleged to*
23 *have been violated.*

24
25 *(c) A citation may specify a date for elimination or correction of the*
26 *condition constituting the violation.*
27

1 (d) A citation may include the assessment of a penalty as specified in
2 subdivision (e).

3
4 (e) The department may assess a penalty in an amount not to exceed
5 one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per day for each day that a violation
6 occurred, and for each day that a violation continues to occur. A
7 separate penalty may be assessed for each violation.

8
9 Section 64426.1 (b), Title 22, of the CCR states:

10
11 (b) A public water system is in violation of the total coliform maximum
12 contaminant level (MCL) when any of the following occurs:

13
14 (1) For a public water system which collects at least 40 samples
15 per month, more than 5.0 percent of the samples collected
16 during any month are total coliform-positive; or

17
18 (2) For a public water system which collects fewer than 40
19 samples per month, more than one sample collected during
20 any month is total coliform-positive; or

21
22 (3) Any repeat sample is fecal coliform-positive or *E. coli*-
23 positive; or

24
25 (4) Any repeat sample following a fecal coliform-positive or *E.*
26 *coli*-positive routine sample is total coliform-positive.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

1
2 The Barry Elementary School domestic water system (System) is classified as a
3 nontransient noncommunity water system serving approximately 650 persons per
4 day. In accordance with Section 64423 of Title 22, the System is required to collect
5 one routine bacteriological sample per month, unless there was a positive
6 bacteriological sample the previous month, in which case, five routine bacteriological
7 samples are required. On March 15, 2016, the System collected a routine
8 bacteriological sample from the distribution system. As a result, the sample showed
9 the presence of total coliform bacteria. Consequently, four repeat samples were
10 taken on March 17, 2016; all of which showed the presence of total coliform as well.
11 The cause of the contamination is unknown. No samples discussed showed the
12 presence of E. coli.

DETERMINATIONS

13
14
15 The Division has determined that the System violated Section 64426.1(b)(2), Title
16 22, of the CCR, in that more than one routine sample was positive for total coliform
17 in the month of March 2016; thus exceeding the total coliform MCL.

DIRECTIVES

18
19
20 The System is hereby directed to take the following actions:

- 21
22 1. Comply with Section 64426.1, Title 22, of the CCR in all future monitoring
23 periods.
- 24
25 2. **Within 30 days** of the issuance of this Citation, provide public notification in
26 accordance with **Attachment 'A'**, to all persons served by the System of the

1 MCL violation as required by Section 64463.4 and Section 64465, Title 22, of
2 the CCR.

3
4 3. Changes and/or modifications to Attachment A shall be not be made unless
5 approved by the Division.

6
7 4. Complete and return **Attachment 'B'** "Certification of Completion of Public
8 Notification" form **within 10 days** of giving public notice. A copy of the notice
9 used to provide public notification shall be attached to the form.

10

23 Nothing in this Citation relieves the System of its obligation to meet the requirements
24 of Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 12, Chapter 4 (California Safe
25 Drinking Water Act), or any regulation, permit, standard or order issued or adopted
26 thereunder.

1 The Division reserves the right to make such modifications to this Citation, as it may
2 deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modifications may be
3 issued as amendments to this Citation and shall be effective upon issuance.
4

5 **FURTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION**

6 The California SDWA authorizes the State Board to: issue citation with assessment
7 of administrative penalties to a public water system for violation or continued
8 violation of the requirements of the California SDWA or any permit, regulation,
9 permit or order issued or adopted thereunder including, but not limited to, failure to
10 correct a violation identified in a citation or compliance order. The California SDWA
11 also authorizes the State Board to take action to suspend or revoke a permit that
12 has been issued to a public water system if the system has violated applicable law
13 or regulations or has failed to comply with an order of the State Board; and to
14 petition the superior court to take various enforcement measures against a public
15 water system that has failed to comply with violates an order of the State Board. The
16 State Board does not waive any further enforcement action by issuance of this
17 citation.
18

19 **PARTIES BOUND**

20 This Citation shall apply to and be binding upon the System, its officers, directors,
21 agents, employees, contractors, successors, and assignees.
22

23 **SEVERABILITY**

24 The directives of this Citation are severable, and the Water System shall comply with
25 each and every provision thereof notwithstanding the effectiveness of any other
26 provision.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

**The Barry Elementary School water system
did not meet Bacteriological Drinking Water Standards
in March 2016**

Our water system violated the bacteriological drinking water standard for March 2016. As our consumers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. A routine sample taken on March 15, 2016, indicated the presence of coliform bacteria. In addition all four follow-up samples taken on March 17, 2016, also showed the presence of total coliform. The standard is that no more than one (1) sample per month may have the presence of total coliform.

What should I do?

- **You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions.** This is not an emergency, If it had been, you would have been notified immediately.
- Usually, coliforms are a sign that there could be a problem with the treatment or distribution system (pipes). Whenever we test for total coliform bacteria in any sample, we also test to see if other bacteria of greater concern, such as fecal coliform or *E. coli*, are present. **We did not find E. Coli bacteria in our testing.**
- People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from U.S. EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1(800) 426-4791.
- If you have other health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

The cause of total coliform bacteria in the drinking water is unknown at this time. The drinking water system was disinfected and flushed over the weekend of March 18-19, 2016, and four additional samples were taken on March 23, 2016. All four samples tested negative for the presence of total coliform bacteria.
