Citation for Noncompliance
Nitrate Monitoring and Reporting Violation
Issued: August 24, 2016

In accordance with Chapter 4, Article 9, Section 116650 of Part 1 of Division 104 of the California Health and Safety Code (CHSC), this Division is authorized to issue a citation for failure to comply with a requirement of Chapter 4 (California Safe Drinking Water Act), or any regulation, standard, permit or order issued thereunder.

Violation

The Yolo County Environmental Health Division (Division) hereby issues a citation to Plainfield Elementary School for failure to comply with Section 116555(a) of the CHSC and Section 64432.1 of Title 22, California Code of Regulations (CCR). Specifically Plainfield Elementary School failed to collect and/or report the required number of Nitrate water samples for 2015.

In accordance with Section 64432.1(a), Plainfield Elementary School is required to collect and have analyzed for Nitrate, one sample from its source per calendar year. As of this date, the Division has not received any results for a sample taken during the compliance period(s): 2015. This is classified as a non-continuing violation.

Directives

Plainfield Elementary School is hereby directed to take the following actions:

1. Comply with Section 64432.1 in all future monitoring periods.
2. Notify all persons served by the Plainfield Elementary School water system of this violation by completing, posting, and returning a copy of *Attachment A* by **August 31, 2016**. This notice must include a written or typed description of corrective actions taken by the water system to prevent this violation from occurring in the future.

3. Delinquent monitoring for Nitrate was completed on June 16, 2016. The water system has returned to compliance for Nitrate monitoring and reporting.
4. The attached public notification must remain posted for a minimum of seven (7) days following a return to compliance.

Civil Penalty

Sections 116650(d) and 116650(e) of CHSC allow for assessment of a civil penalty for failure to comply with requirements of Chapter 4. Failure to comply with any provision of this citation may result in the Division imposing a civil penalty not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per day. A separate penalty may be assessed for each violation.

Under the Yolo County Ordinance, preparation of this citation as well as other enforcement activities will be billed at \$152 per hour to the water system. An invoice for one hour of report writing will be billed to the water system account in the month of September 2016 and is due upon receipt.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

NITRATE MONITORING REQUIREMENTS NOT MET FOR PLAINFIELD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The Plainfield Elementary School water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the past year and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the compliance period, 2015, we did not monitor or test for nitrate and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the aforementioned compliance period, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

Health Effects: Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL may quickly become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die because high nitrate levels can interfere with the capacity of the infant's blood to carry oxygen. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blueness of the skin. High nitrate levels may also affect the oxygen-carrying ability of the blood of pregnant women.
