RESCISSION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Lahontan Region (Regional Board) finds:

Susanville Recycling Center

On August 14, 1986, the Regional Board adopted Board Order No. 6-86-90 prescribing Waste Discharge Requirements for the Susanville Recycling Center (Site). The Site is located at 474-215 Big Sky Blvd. Susanville, and is approximately 600 feet from the Susan River. The Site was a retail outlet for automotive parts from dismantled automobiles. Oil, coolant, brake fluids, and other waste oils were drained and put into 55 gallon barrels for removal by a petroleum recycler. There have been no known releases to the ground or surface water while the Site was in operation.

The Susanville Recycling Center discontinued operations approximately three years ago and a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment was conducted by Stantec, Inc. at the Site for the sale of the property. The Phase I Environmental Site Assessment found no evidence of adverse environmental impacts to the subject property. Mr. Glen Roberts purchased the Site and the use of the Site was changed from an automotive dismantler to a mini-storage facility. The new operation does not pose a threat to water quality. Additionally, there is no information that the former use polluted, or contaminated ground water, or surface water. However, rescinding this Order does not limit the Regional Board's authority if new information indicates that pollution, or water contamination, from the Site has occurred. Therefore, it is not against the public interest to rescind Board Order No. 6-86-90.

It is hereby Ordered that the Board Order No. 6-86-90 be rescinded.
