# Regular Meeting, Continued 7:00 p.m., February 8, 2006

Chair Jack Clarke called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Board members present: John Brissenden, Jim Chapman, Keith Dyas, Amy Horne, Ph.D., Eric Sandel and Susan Van Dam. Board members absent: None.

## 2. PUBLIC FORUM

Carl Gustafson, Squaw Valley resident, expressed concern regarding the diversion of water from Squaw Creek and asked the Regional Board to consider filing a complaint with the State Water Resources Control Board. He handed out and read into the record a petition prepared by Lizabeth Day and Les Wilson, Squaw Valley Mutual Water Company.

David Coupe noted that Mr. Gustafson's request and the petition pertained predominantly to a water rights issue and explained that the jurisdiction of the Regional Board is water quality. He suggested that the parties contact the State Water Resources Control Board's Division of Water Rights for further investigation of the matter.

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Cindi Mitton gave the staff presentation and recommended the Board adopt the Administrative Civil Liability Order as proposed.

Mr. Singer noted staff is reviewing permit conditions for all of the hatcheries and the Board will be considering adoption of the revised permits before the end of the fiscal year. Mr. Sandel commented that the effluent limits need to be revisited.

With no further testimony, Mr. Clarke closed the public hearing.

Cindi Mitton gave the staff presentation, and suggested the Board adopt the Administrative Civil Liability Order with the following changes: page 2, order 3 – change \$12,000 to \$15,000; page 3, order 5 – change 40 CFR Section 123.27(a) to 40 CFR Section 123.27(d)(2)(iii).

With no further testimony, Mr. Clarke closed the public hearing.

Dr. Horne suggested a change to page 9, 3.(a) of the order, striking the words <u>petroleum hydrocarbons</u>, including (underlining added for clarity).

Mr. Clarke reopened the public hearing. Mr. Singer and Mr. Booth responded to questions from the Board.

With no further testimony, Mr. Clarke closed the public hearing.
