# **REPORTS**

## 2. Executive Officer's Report

Ms. Kouyoumdjian, Executive Officer, presented the <u>June Written Report</u> and gave additional updates on:

- The Mono Lake Committee was thanked for their informative presentation on water quality and water supply issues in the Mono Lake Basin.
- Staff traveled down to the Bridgeport Valley in May to offer permit assistance to the ranchers Doug Cushman, Bruce Worden and Doug Smith were commended for their assistance.
- Daryl Gomez joined our South Lake Tahoe Office as an Office Assistant and will help both the Victorville and Lake Tahoe Offices. The Regional Board is seeking applications for two Engineering Geologists positions in the Victorville Office.
- Item 15 on the Consent Calendar was discussed, including local governments and staff efforts working through the individual implementation challenges. Three key points were mentioned about the item:
  - 1. The Pollutant Load Reduction Plans before the Board are an important step in complying with the Municipal NPDES Permit;
  - 2. All three local plans comply with permit requirements; and
  - 3. Most importantly, the Plans provide a roadmap for reducing pollutant loading to Lake Tahoe and documenting progress at achieving our TMDL goals.

- Key projects initiated by the City of Lake Tahoe, Placer County, and El Dorado County were discussed.
- Three updates regarding the PG&E Compressor Station Chromium 6 Cleanup were summarized. The Water Supply Panel hosted by the Regional Board at the Hinkley School, on Wednesday evening May 22 was a very successful local community meeting and the water experts provided some great information to the public. A second public meeting was held on June 6, to walk the community through the final EIR for the Hinkley Compressor Station Cleanup. At the July Board meeting a separate agenda item on Hinkley remediation updates will be presented. It will start with the staff presentation; followed by an update from PG&E. The presentation will then end with an update from the CAC

Reports by the Board:

Mr. Sandel informed the Board that the North Tahoe Public Utility District's Board has authorized the complete rebuilding of the Dollar Sewer Pump Station.

Mr. Jardine participated in the June 10 Chair's Teleconference and reported that the upcoming WQCC Agenda is being prepared. During the "Hot Topics" portion of the teleconference, Mr. Jardine shared the Hinkley Water Panel Meeting and the completion of the Final Hinkley EIR. Additionally, Mr. Jardine shared Item 15 from the June Agenda regarding the activities of the Enforcement Sub-Committee and the excellent job staff has done.

Chairman Pumphrey gave an update from the March Chair's Meeting. The Governor's Office and EPA Representatives requested that Regional Boards work on resolving interagency conflicts and climate change issues outside of Board meetings. The Chair was happy that our Board is ahead of the curve on this request. The Sierra Water Summit took place June 11-13. From this three day meeting the take away message was that all Agencies need to work together on common goals.
