Consideration of the proposed resolution will be at a public hearing to be held at 9:00 A.M., Thursday, December 4, 2003 at the City of Simi Valley, Council Chambers, 2929 Tapo Canyon Road, Simi Valley, California.

Actions to amend the Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region will be taken in accordance with a regulatory program exempt pursuant to section 21080.5 of the Public Resources Code from the requirement to prepare an environmental impact report under the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.) and with other applicable law and regulations.
