
The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region (Regional Board) was scheduled to consider a proposed amendment to the *Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region* (Basin Plan) to incorporate a Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL) for Bacteria at the Harbor Beaches of Ventura County on September 06, 2007. In response to stakeholder request, the public hearing date for TMDL has been changed. The TMDL is now schedule to be considered on **November 01, 2007 at 9:00 a.m.** at a location to be determined.
