

This notice is to advise any interested parties that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, will consider adoption of an amendment to the Basin Plan to incorporate a Total Maximum Daily Load for PCBs, Organochlorine Pesticides, and Sediment Toxicity in McGrath Lake. Consideration of the proposed amendment will be at a public hearing to be held on October 1, 2009 at the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, 700 North Alameda Street, Los Angeles, California.

Actions to amend the Basin Plan will be taken in accordance with a regulatory program exempt under Section 21080.5 of the Public Resources Code from the requirement to prepare an environmental impact report under the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and with other applicable laws and regulations.
