

DESCRIPTION: Proposed Basin Plan Amendment to incorporate a Total Maximum Daily Load for Pesticides and PCBs in Machado Lake.

This notice is to advise interested parties that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Los Angeles Region, will consider adoption of an amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for a Total Maximum Daily Load for Pesticides and PCBs in Machado Lake. Consideration of the proposed resolution will be at a public hearing to be held on July 8 & 9, 2010 at the Ventura County Government Center, Hall of Administration, 800 South Victoria Ave., Ventura California.

Actions to amend the Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region will be taken in accordance with a regulatory program exempt under Section 21080.5 of the Public Resources Code from the requirement to prepare an environmental impact report under the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and with other applicable laws and regulations.
