Subject: New Permit for Boeing

To: Responsible Parties at The LA Water Board,

I have been a resident of Simi Valley for 25 years. I moved to the area to get away from the traffic congestion and unhealthy air pollution in Los Angeles. Unfortunately, after living in Simi Valley for the first three or four years I became aware of the disasters at the SSFL. I continued to follow the reports of the contamination of the site as well as the talks regarding future cleanup efforts.

It has come to my attention that Boeing is planning on filing for a new permit that will allow them to further contaminate the water in my community far beyond the current unacceptable levels. If anything, based upon the most recent information that has been disclosed by NASA, The Department of Energy, EPA and government regulatory agencies, as well as Boeing's history of numerous violations in the past, I would have expected that **the new permit would include much more stringent requirements.** Instead, I understand that Boeing is requesting that they are allowed to pollute with almost four times the amount of zinc, mercury, thallium and boron. Additionally, Boeing wants to eliminate all monitoring and pollution limits from outfalls 12, 13 , 14. I believe that they also want to eliminate monthly average limits for pollutants.

One other aspect of this situation is just as confusing and appalling to me. It is my understanding that the Regional Water Board is headed by Charlie Stringer, a Principal in a firm that was commissioned by Boeing to work towards reducing cleanup standards. If this is not an example of a conflict of interest, what is?

Needless to say, I trust that you will treat the requirements for clean water in my community the same as you would for the area where you and your family live. Please refuse to issue a permit that allows Boeing to further pollute the area where I live and endanger the lives of residents of Simi Valley and any surrounding areas.
