TENTATIVE WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS (WDRs)/ NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT AND TENTATIVE TIME SCHEDULE ORDER (TSO) FOR CAMROSA WATER DISTRICT, CAMROSA WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY (NPDES NO. CA0059501, CI-6769)

We have completed our review of your application for renewal of Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit and your request for interim limitations and a compliance schedule for total dissolved solids (TDS) and chloride. Pursuant to the Federal Clean Water Act, as amended, and in accordance with the California Water Code (CWC), tentative WDRs and a tentative amended TSO have been prepared.

Enclosed are copies of the following:

3. Tentative TSO.

In accordance with administrative procedures, this Board at a public hearing to be held on **November 06, 2014, at 9:00 a.m.**, at the **Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Board Room, 700 North Alameda Street, Los Angeles, California**, will consider the enclosed tentative requirements and comments submitted in writing regarding any and all portions thereof.

The Board will hear any testimony pertinent to this discharge and the tentative requirements. It is expected that the Board will take action at the hearing; however, as testimony indicates, the Board, at its discretion, may order further action by staff. The agenda for the meeting will be posted on the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board's website (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/losangeles/board_info/agenda/index.shtml) approximately one week prior to the meeting.

Written comments regarding the tentative Order must be received at the Board's office by **5 p.m. on October 10, 2014**, in order to be evaluated by staff and included in the Board's agenda folder. Comments received after that date will not be considered, absent extraordinary circumstances. Timely submittal of written comments is required to ensure that all comments are accurately and fully included in the administrative record, that Board staff is able to provide timely review, and that Regional Board members have sufficient time to give full consideration to the comments and issues raised.

With respect to the public notices, in accordance with the Federal Clean Water Act, as amended, and the California Code of Regulations, you are required to follow the enclosed instructions for publication or posting of the notice no later than October 10, 2014.

Failure to publish or post the notice by the above date may require us to reschedule this item for a later hearing and will require the publication or posting of a second notice. Please notify this Board by telephone when the notice has been published and submit the proof of publication or posting as required in the enclosed instructions. Proof of posting or publication of the notice must be received by the Executive Officer of this Regional Water Board no later than October 22, 2014.
