**NOTICE OF PROPOSED ISSUANCE OF  
AMENDED TIME SCHEDULE ORDER (TSO) FOR  
WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
(National Pollutant Discharges Elimination System (NPDES) Permit)**

The City of Thousand Oaks (hereinafter the City) discharges tertiary-treated wastewater from its Hill Canyon Wastewater Treatment Plant (Hill Canyon WWTP) to the North Fork Arroyo Conejo, tributary to Calleguas Creek, which are waters of the State of California and United States. The discharge is regulated under waste discharge requirements contained in Order No. R4-2014-0064, adopted by this Regional Water Board on May 6, 2014. Order No. R4-2014-0064 serves as a permit under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES No. CA0056294). On May 6, 2014, the Regional Water Board also adopted Time Schedule Order (TSO) No. R4-2014-0065, which prescribed the City interim effluent limits for copper and chloride.

On October 31, 2014, the City requested an extension of the time schedule for chloride in TSO No. R4-2014-0065 beyond the original January 31, 2015 deadline. On January 30, 2015, in response to the City's request, the Executive Officer, pursuant to his delegated authority from the Regional Water Board, and following a thirty-day notice and comment period, adopted TSO No. R4-2014-0065-A01, which extended the time schedule for chloride to December 31, 2016.

On January 19, 2017, the City requested an extension of the time schedule for copper in TSO No. R4-2014-0065-A01, beyond the original March 26, 2017 deadline. The City has been implementing a polymer demonstration project to try and meet the copper final effluent limitations, and has also been implementing feasible source control strategies. The City requires additional time to continue these efforts to achieve enhanced copper removal and reduction. Further, the revised waste load allocations for copper, contained in the *Amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Los Angeles Region to Revise the Total Maximum Daily Load for Metals and Selenium for the Calleguas Creek, its Tributaries, and Mugu Lagoon* (Revised Metals TMDL), are not yet in effect as the TMDL is currently going through the necessary approval process by the State Water Board, Office of Administrative Law, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Once effective, the Revised Metals TMDL will be incorporated into the City's NPDES permit.

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Executive Officer, pursuant to his delegated authority from the Regional Water Board, tentatively proposes to amend TSO No. R4-2014-0065-A01, by extending the time schedule for copper to December 31, 2017. No changes to the NPDES permit are being proposed at this time.

Written comments must be **received** by the Regional Water Board by 5:00 p.m. on March 10, 2017.
