TENTATIVE AMENDMENT TO TIME SCHEDULE ORDER (TSO) – CITY OF THOUSAND OAKS, HILL CANYON WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT (TSO NO. R4-2014-0065, CI-4917)

The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) received the City of Thousand Oaks' letter dated October 31, 2014, requesting an extension of the time schedule for chloride in Time Schedule Order (TSO) No. R4-2014-0065 beyond the original January 31, 2015 deadline. On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Executive Officer, pursuant to his delegated authority from the Regional Water Board, tentatively proposes to amend TSO No. R4-2014-0065, by extending the time schedule for chloride to December 31, 2016.

Enclosed are copies of the Tentative Amended TSO and Notice of Proposed Issuance of Amended TSO. As indicated in the Notice, the Executive Officer intends to issue the Amended TSO without a public hearing. Persons wishing to comment on and/or submit evidence regarding the Tentative Amended TSO for the Executive Officer to consider must submit written comments, such that they are **received** by the Regional Water Board by **5:00 p.m. on January 19, 2015**. Untimely written comments will not be considered nor responded to. The Executive Officer will consider all timely written comments prior to administratively issuing the Amended TSO.
