Item 9.a Enforcement Report by Mr. Hugh Marley, Chief of Enforcement Section.

Mr. Marley gave an update on Enforcement activities, the expedited payment letter process, management of two statewide permits for stormwater, and the Oil and Gas Operations Initiative.

Item 10. Update from State Board. Vice Chair Fran Spivy-Weber discussed issues that are the currently the focus of State Board in addition to the following:

- On April 11, 2014 there will be a Chairs meeting held in Sacramento
- The current drought is the main focus of State Board
- Current drought budget money is \$660.6 million

Item 13. Informational update from the Office of Enforcement (OOE) and summary on matters of advanced enforcement topics under the enforcement Policy and on OE's Enforcement Priorities for 2014.

Mr. Cris Carrigan, State Board - Office of Enforcement presented the report. (Mr. Carrigan made, but was not limited to the following points during his presentation):

- OE strives to assist the Regional Board with attaining their enforcement goals
- OE acts as an advisor to assist the Executive Officers
- The Executive Officer (EO) acts as the Board members advisor on enforcement
- Compliance is an excellent way to assist disadvantaged communities

- OE is anticipating taking on the Drinking Water Program
- Discussed recent successes of the program
- Working on the regulation of marijuana to assist the Regional Boards with developing regulatory programs
- Objectives of OE are to have fair, consistent, and transparent hearings/enforcement

Item 11. Consideration of tentative Waste Discharge Requirements for Calleguas Municipal Water District; Regional Salinity Management Pipeline, Thousand Oaks.

This matter was moved to the consent calendar. Dr. Cindy Lin, USEPA indicated that she is in support of the requirements. There was a motion for approval.

Item 12. Consideration of Amendment to Waste Discharge Requirements and Water Recycling Requirements for Leo J. Vander Lans Water Treatment Facility and Alamitos Barrier Recycled Water Project for Water Replenishment District and Los Angeles Department of Public Works, Long Beach.

Dr. Cathy Chang, Water Replenishment District expressed support for the permit, with the Change sheet.

Board Member concerns:

- Commended staff on the Recycled Water permits
- Asked clarification on the Salt and Nutrients and whether or not there is a problem?

MOTION: To adopt the Amended Waste Discharge Requirements and Water Recycling Requirements with the Change sheet.

Item 14, City of Avalon - Informational Update and Summary by, Counsel for the City of Avalon.

The City provided an overview of the City's efforts to comply with the Cease and Desist order R4-2012-0077 adopted by this Regional Board on April 5, 2012.

Mr. Ben Harvey, City of Avalon gave a report to the Board indicating, but not limited to the following:

- The City has made huge improvements
- Have improved grades from F's to B's
- All sampling stations improved in 2013
- City is committed to water quality and committed efforts to improve water quality

Board questions:

- How is infrastructure coming in to play?
- Commended the City and stated that the board hopes that this effort continues.
- With the City's growing tourism, are there plans for a future treatment plant?
- Heal the Bay was thanked for bringing this information to the Board a couple of years ago.

Item 15, Update on status of efforts by State and Regional Board staff and local water agencies to manage and/or regulate potable water distribution systems and wellheads to surface waters in Coastal Watersheds of Los Angeles and Ventura Counties.

Mr. Sam Unger, Executive Officer made introductory remarks, indicating that fast, current, and proposed approaches to ensuring water quality protection.

Ms. Deborah Smith, Chief Deputy Executive Officer discussed past, current, and proposed approaches to ensuring water quality protection. (Ms. Smith made, but was not limited to the following points):

- Status of addressing potable water discharges
- Discharges from Potable Water Systems (PWS)
- Evolution of addressing PWS
- Potable water discharges in the context of updated MS4 permits

Ms. Renee Purdy, Chief Regional Programs section, made, but was not limited to the following points during her presentation clarifying potable water discharges:

- Potable water discharges are non-storm water discharges
- These discharges should be carried under a separate NPDES permit
- Potable water discharges have conditional exemptions
- The MS4 permit acknowledges that some of the discharges need to be covered under a separate NPDES permit

Mr. David Hung, Chief of Watershed Regulatory section discussed what other Regional boards are doing:

- Other Boards have issued general permits to cover these discharges
- Monitoring is required for oil and grease, TSS, TPA, phosphorus, and nitrogen
- There have been two Stakeholder meetings held on this issue over the past twelve months
- Water purveyors are undecided in their support of a permit

Mr. Adan Ortega, provided an update on Los Angeles County MS4 permit as it applies to Public Water Systems (PWS).

Mr. David Kimbrough, Pasadena Water and Power, made, but was not limited to the following points during his presentation:

- The MS4 permit requires permittees to work with PWS
- A Multi-Regional Permit has been under development for over one year

Speaker cards:

• Mr. Ray Tahir, TEC Environmental (Expressed that there is no definition of Community Water Systems in the MS4 permit, and that this needs to be clarified.)

- Ms. Tatiana Gaur, L.A. Waterkeeper (non Stormwater discharges are prohibited; and the MOU has a lack of transparency)
- Ms. Angela George, Los Angeles County Department of Public Works *The County has been using the MS4*)
- Ms. Brandy Hancocks, CA-Nevada AWWA (Have operated under a separate MS4 for fifteen years)
- Ms. Vivian Castro, City of Covina (Believe that what is provided in the MS4 is working, and asked the Board to allow the permit to do its job)

Board questions and concerns:

- Do not understand why we would do separate permits for entities and the MS4 is supposed to make entities work together on this issue
- Member expressed that she believes the MS4 does what is necessary and do not believe the MOU is needed.
- Member expressed the MS4 did not regulate water purveyors and to allow an even playing field, the Board needs to issue water purveyors a separate permit. But, this member thought that it should be a Region 4 NPDES permit, not a multi-region permit for water purveyors
