SUBJECT: PUBLIC MEETING TO RECONSIDER THE SCOPE OF BOARD-ADOPTED TRASH TMDLs, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THOSE FOR THE BALLONA CREEK AND LA RIVER WATERSHEDS

The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Regional Water Board) will hold a public meeting in accordance with requirements of the Statewide Trash Amendments (Resolution No. 2015-0019) to reconsider the scope of its trash TMDLs, to particularly consider an approach that would focus on MS4 permittees' trash-control efforts in high-trash generation areas within their jurisdictions.

BACKGROUND

On April 7, 2015, the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) adopted an Amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for Ocean Waters of California (Ocean Plan) to Control Trash, and Part 1 Trash Provisions of the Water Quality Control Plan for Inland Surface Waters, Enclosed Bays, and Estuaries of California (ISWEBE Plan). Together, they are collectively referred to as "the Trash Amendments". These Trash Amendments were approved by the Office of Administrative Law and became effective on December 2, 2015.

Prior to the adoption of the Statewide Trash Amendments by the State Water Board, the following Trash and Debris TMDLs were effective in the Los Angeles Region:

While the Statewide Trash Amendments do not apply to the Trash TMDLs listed above, the Los Angeles Regional Water Board is required to convene a public meeting to reconsider the approach to these TMDLs that would focus MS4 permittees' trash-control efforts on high-trash generation areas.
