Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements

NACO West Russian River RV Park  
Order No. 86-197, WDID No.1B83006OSON

Sonoma County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region (Regional Water Board) finds that:

1. On December 4, 1986, the Regional Water Board adopted WDR Order No. 86-197, requiring NACO West Russian River RV Park to comply with discharge prohibitions and effluent limitations for the treatment and discharge of domestic waste at their facility in Cloverdale, California. Order No. 86-197 permitted the discharge of treated domestic wastewater via on-site leach fields. Order No. 86-197 also required compliance with Contingency Planning and Notification Requirements Order No. 74-151 and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 86-197.
2. On March 23, 2009, MHC NAC Inc. submitted a Report of Waste Discharge, notifying the Regional Water Board of their recent acquisition of the NACO West Russian River RV Park. Additional information regarding the on-site wastewater treatment and disposal system was received September 8, 2009. Based on review of the Report of Waste Discharge and the additional information received by MHC NAC Inc., the NACO West Russian River RV Park was enrolled under General Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges to Land by Small Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems Order No. 97-10-DWQ. The General Order was adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board in 1997 for systems with maximum daily flows of up to 20,000 gallons per day that discharge to land. Therefore, the requirements contained in the Order No. 86-197 are no longer necessary for the protection of water quality.
3. This action to rescind WDRs is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.), pursuant to Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Sections 15060(c)(2) and 15061(b). Based on the foregoing findings and the facts underlying them, this action to rescind WDRs cannot reasonably be expected to have any potentially significant adverse effect on the environment.
4. On April 29, 2010, after due notice to the Permittees and all other affected persons, the Regional Water Board conducted a public hearing and evidence was received regarding rescission of the WDRs.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. 86-197, and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 86-197 are rescinded except for enforcement purposes.
