RESOLUTION NO. R1-2012-0035

NOMINATION FOR THE  
UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND  
EMERGENCY, ABANDONED, RECALCITRANT ACCOUNT

- WHEREAS, The investigation and cleanup of polluted groundwater resulting from discharges of petroleum hydrocarbons from underground storage tanks is a high priority task for the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board); and
- WHEREAS, Chapter 6.75 of the California Health and Safety Code authorizes the State Water Resources Control Board to provide Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Funds to Regional Water Boards and Local Implementing Agencies for direct cleanup of petroleum underground storage tank sites; and
- WHEREAS, Funds are available in the Emergency, Abandoned, Recalcitrant (EAR) Account for petroleum underground storage sites where the responsible party is either unable or unwilling to implement corrective action to protect public health, safety and the environment; and
- WHEREAS, The Regional Water Board on March 15, 2012 considered the recommendations of staff regarding underground storage tank sites in the North Coast Region where prompt action is required and the responsible party is unable to implement corrective actions; and
- WHEREAS, The Regional Water Board determined that the use of the EAR Account is necessary.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following petroleum underground storage tank sites be submitted to the State Water Resources Control Board for inclusion in the Fiscal Year 2012-2013 statewide priority list for funding through the EAR Account:
