On April 26, 2011, we received a request for an extension of time for completing the tasks included in Water Code Section 13267 Order and Cleanup and Abatement Order No. R1-2011-0045 (CAO). This request has not been granted because it was both late and incomplete. Specifically, it was not received 15 days in advance of the task deadline as required by the CAO, it did not include adequate justification for the additional time, and it did not propose a revised schedule to complete the tasks. Additionally, our staff has attempted to contact you and your attorney without response. Please be aware that you are currently in violation of the CAO.

We received an email dated July 22, 2011, which included a letter dated May 19, 2011, which our office had not received prior to July 22, 2011. The letter dated May 19, 2011, advised that your civil engineer would be inspecting the Park, and you would be responding to the tasks of Cleanup and Abatement Order (CAO) No. R1-2011-0045. Please advise us if further remedial work has been conducted at the Park.

The deadlines for Task 1, Task 2, Task 3, and Task 4 have now passed. Additionally, monthly progress reports have not been submitted as required by the CAO. Pursuant to Water Code section 13350, failure to comply with CAO requirements and deadlines may result in assessment of administrative civil liability in amounts of up to \$5,000.00 per day and not less than \$500.00 per each day in which the discharge occurs and for each day the cleanup and abatement order is violated.

The discharge of sewage at this Mobile Home Park has adversely impacted water quality and constitutes a threat to public health and safety. Delays in compliance with the CAO have prolonged the impact to water quality and condition of nuisance. Your efforts and timeliness, or lack thereof, in correcting the problems will factor significantly

into the amount of the penalties which the Regional Water Board may assess in this matter.
