Problem Description

Unauthorized discharges of petroleum hydrocarbons from underground storage tanks occurred at the above-referenced property, resulting in the contamination of soil and groundwater. Contaminants of concern included gasoline, diesel, benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, total xylenes, and fuel oxygenates.

Actions Completed

Two underground storage tanks were excavated and removed from the site in 1997. Soil and groundwater investigations were conducted to define the extent of contamination. Corrective action included soil excavation, removal, and appropriate disposal of contaminated soil. No sensitive receptors have been impacted by the contamination.

Proposed Action

A no further action determination related to the discharge of petroleum hydrocarbons. This site meets the closure criteria specified by the State Water Resources Control Board's "Low-Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy."

Unless significant comments are received or new information is presented regarding this site, Regional Water Board staff plans to proceed with the "no further action" determination upon conclusion of the comment period.
