NOTICE OF INTENT

GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

FOR

DISCHARGES TO LAND BY SMALL DOMESTIC WASTEWATER TREATMENT
SYSTEMS

French's R.V. Camp
657 US Highway 101
Piercy, California
Humboldt County

The French's RV Camp Facility (Facility) located at 657 US Highway 101 in Piercy, California, is a 24 space recreation vehicle/ campground with 2 new 5000 square feet "visitor serving" commercial buildings. Sanitary sewer service is provided by an onsite wastewater system consisting of two systems. System (1) will be a conventional gravity flow sewage disposal system with four (4) septic tanks in series to serve the kitchen waste that is required to pass through a grease trap prior to entering the system. System (2) will be used by 17 full hook up RV sites, and one single family residence. There will be a septic tank for every three (3) RV sites these will enter a final dosing tank before they are sent to the leachfield. At the Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board) staff's request, the Facility submitted a report of waste discharge (ROWD). On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, North Coast Region, intends to enroll the Facility under *General Waste Discharge Requirements For Discharges To Land By Small Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems Water Quality Order No. 97-10-DWQ*.
