

**05/07/13 BD MEETING – ITEM #3  
CHANGE SHEET #1 (CIRCULATED 5/1/13)**

On page 2 of the draft Resolution, making the following changes:

13. The North Coast Water Board adopted [Resolution No. R1-2012-0079](#) in August 2012 to request that the State Water Board approve funding from the CAA for the Project; **and**
14. The requested allocation is consistent with the purposes of the Water Code section 13442. Water Code section 13442 provides that the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) may order monies to be paid from CAA to a public agency with the authority to cleanup or abate the effects of a waste in order “to assist it in cleaning up the waste or abating its effects on waters of the state.”; **and**
15. The State Water Board has an expectation that in order to fully realize the recovery of the Elk River watershed, the North Coast Water Board will:
  - a. Ensure that the model developed with these funds will be utilized to establish a Remediation Action Plan for the purpose of initiating a full-scale recovery effort in the watershed. The Elk River Recovery Assessment will result in the Implementation Framework in Fiscal Year 2015/16. Upon its completion, the North Coast Water Board will pursue development of the Remediation Action Plan and permitting. The North Coast Water Board anticipates finalizing the Remediation Action Plan in 2018 and implementing it, including remediation of the in-stream stored sediment, by 2023; and
  - b. Aggressively seek a wide variety of potential funding sources, including other state, federal and private funding sources, for implementation of the recovery effort.
