STATE WATER BOARD AWARDS \$75 MILLION FOR CLEAN WATER PROJECTS

SACRAMENTO—The State Water Resources Control Board has awarded approximately \$75 million in grants for a variety of water management and pollution prevention projects. The locally proposed projects focus on watershed management and diffuse sources of pollution referred to as "nonpoint source" problems.

The competitively awarded grants are funded by the state through bonds approved by voters in Propositions 13, 40 and 50. Additional funding may be provided from the federal government's Clean Water Act appropriations.

State Water Board Chair Tam Doduc said after the board approved the grants, "We are making good on the state's promise to protect water in all parts of California. These grants range from the Trinity in the north to the Tijuana River on the Mexican border. We are focused on such diverse environmental challenges as improving Lake Tahoe's watershed to tackling the problem of salinity in the Chino Basin. These projects will make a difference Californians can see." (A complete list of projects is attached below.)

The State Water Board administers a number of grant and loan programs that help protect human health and the environment by guarding water bodies, improving drinking water and wastewater treatment and cleaning up California's beaches, shores and ocean.

Several additional projects were given provisional approval for funding if any projects fail to use their funding or if more money is available.
