The above-referenced petitions are complete and the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) will begin its review. The petitions will be consolidated for review since they are legally and factually related.¹

Response and Administrative Record:

The Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Los Angeles Water Board) and other interested persons may file a written response to the petitions. Responses are due within 30 days of the date of this letter, addressed to my attention. In addition, all responses must be sent to the Petitioners at the addresses listed on Exhibits A and B. Please also copy all persons listed on the cc list below which includes staff and counsel at the Los Angeles Water Board. Electronic submissions and copies are strongly encouraged.

The Los Angeles Water Board is requested to file the administrative record (copied on both sides, if submitted in hard copy) within this 30-day period. The Los Angeles Water Board is encouraged to file the administrative record electronically if feasible.

The administrative record to be filed by the Los Angeles Water Board constitutes the evidentiary record for the State Water Board's review of the petitions. Any person requesting that the State Water Board consider evidence that was not part of the administrative record before the Los Angeles Water Board must do so in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 23, section 2050.6.

State Water Board Workshop on Receiving Water Limitations

On November 20, 2012, the State Water Board held a workshop to take public comment on an issue paper discussing several alternatives to addressing receiving water limitations in National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s). Information from that workshop is available at http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/stormwater/rwl.shtml. The State Water Board expects now to schedule a workshop in early fall of 2013 to take input on the particular approach to receiving water limitations established in Order No. R4-2012-0175 (Los Angeles MS4 Permit).

The Los Angeles MS4 Permit appears to provide a compliance alternative to the State Water Board's precedential receiving water limitations for MS4s. Under the Los Angeles MS4 Permit, dischargers that are in compliance with the requirements and milestones of an approved watershed management program/enhanced watershed management program are also generally deemed to be in compliance with the Permit's receiving water limitations. All interested persons are invited to submit comments within 30 days of the date of this letter, addressing the following questions:

- 1. Is the watershed management program/enhanced watershed management program alternative contained in the Los Angeles MS4 Permit an appropriate approach to revising the receiving water limitations in MS4 permits?
- 2. If not, what revisions to the watershed management program/enhanced watershed management program alternative of the Los Angeles MS4 Permit would make the approach a viable alternative for receiving water limitations in MS4 permits?

Prohibition on Ex Parte Communications

The LA MS4 Permit is subject to the prohibition on ex parte communications.³ Interested persons, therefore, may not communicate with State Water Board members regarding the

above questions except through submission of timely written comments and through oral comments at the future workshop and subsequent meetings.

A public notice of the workshop date, time, and location will be issued in the near future.
