Hi Marilyn,

I just called and left a message on your office phone and wanted to follow up via email. I received a call from Dania Huggins at the CVRWQCB regarding the sediment NELAP/ELAP issue. She had received a call from Steve Boggs that he received an accreditation package from Nautilus however the sediment toxicity testing was not included. He told Dania that it would be very simple to add (just mark a box and add the SOPs if they weren't already included) and that if Nautilus did this quickly within the review time frame there would be no change to cost or process. Dania asked if I could follow up with Nautilus to make sure that the accreditation occurs quickly and within the time frame that the CVRWQCB anticipates which may include a simple call to Steve Boggs to insure that the sediment toxicity is included in the accreditation package.

If you could let me know that status of the sediment toxicity accreditation as soon as possible I would appreciate it.
