RESOLUTION NO. R5-2007-0062

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO SIGN A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AMONG THE STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD, THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD, THE AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONERS OF BUTTE AND GLENN COUNTIES, AND THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PESTICIDE REGULATION

WHEREAS, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (hereafter Central Valley Water Board) finds:

1. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), the Central Valley Water Board, the Agricultural Commissioners of Butte and Glenn Counties, and the Department of Pesticide Regulation have had a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in place since 29 June 2005.
2. The Central Valley Water Board and the Agricultural Commissioners of Butte and Glenn Counties have worked cooperatively on a pilot program under the MOU and the Central Valley Water Board's Irrigated Lands Conditional Waiver Program to improve water quality utilizing the Agricultural Commissioners' institutional knowledge of local geographic, hydrologic, and agronomic conditions of the watersheds in their jurisdictions.
3. The State Water Board, the Central Valley Water Board, the Agricultural Commissioners of Butte and Glenn Counties, and the Department of Pesticide Regulation wish to revise and extend the MOU another four years to further their work, use the results to evaluate whether to expand the program in the Central Valley Region, and take advantage of efficiencies through this unique partnership.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

1. The Central Valley Water Board authorizes the Executive Officer to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the State Water Resources Control Board, the Agricultural Commissioners of Butte County and Glenn County and the California Department of Pesticide Regulation.
