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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Chapter 961, Statutes of 1992 (SB 1865, Hart) requires the Director of Environmental Health of each coastal county to report to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) annually by March 30 the number of beach closures due to threats to public health within their jurisdiction. The SWRCB is then required to submit this information to the Legislature by the following September 30. This, the second of these annual reports, documents 85 beach closures for 1994, two less than last year.

Table 1 lists the number of beach closures for 1994 for each coastal county, organized geographically from north to south. Figure 1 presents the same information on a map of California. Following the summary table and map are the submittals from each coastal county to the SWRCB in a standard format.

The vast majority of the closures were due to the release of inadequately treated sewage resulting from broken or damaged lines, heavy influx of rainwater, car accidents, grease blocking the lines, roots, power outages, and pump failures. The other causes of closures included oil spills and urban runoff. All counties reporting beach closures have less than ten closures except for Orange and San Diego Counties. Orange County had 17 closures, and San Diego County had 51 of the 85 closures statewide. San Diego County has three permanent beach closures due to chronic elevated bacteria levels resulting from contaminated water flowing north across the International Border. There were no beach closures in the counties north of San Francisco Bay.

The State Water Resources Control Board and the coastal regional water quality control boards operate several programs to address the causes of beach closures. The core regulatory program of monitoring, permitting and enforcement plays a vital role. For example, in regard to sewage spills greater than 100 gallons, the responsible sewerage entity must report such spills to the appropriate regional water quality control board. In addition to follow-up activities, such incidents are tabulated and presented to Regional Board Members at their regularly scheduled monthly public meetings. In regard to oil spills, the typical reportable quantity is one barrel and such instances are reported to the Office of Emergency Services which in-turn contacts the appropriate regional water quality control board. Finally, for situations where urban runoff has caused a closure, the recent implementation of stormwater permits under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (federal permits program) will assist follow-up. Other programs which assist in addressing the cause of beach closures include cooperative and public outreach partnership endeavors such as the Santa Monica Bay Restoration Project, the development of ocean waters standards as represented by the California Ocean Plan and funding assistance programs such as the State Revolving Fund Program.

Compared to 1993, the first year data were collected, 1994 showed nine counties with no change in the number of closures, four counties with more closures, and four counties with fewer closures. Given that data have only been collected for two years and there are

numerous variables for any one year, it is too early to establish any definitive trend analysis. Variables which defy trend analysis include the following:

- Often, professional judgement and the past experience form the sole basis of determining when a beach is to be closed. The state of the science precludes scientific comparisons of the number of beach closures from county to county.
- The presence of year-round climatic conditions conducive to beach recreation activities, especially during the rainy season, is cause for more aggressive monitoring of southern California beaches than elsewhere. Aggressive monitoring elsewhere in the state or in the country might reveal different patterns of beach closures.
- Year-to-year changes in the duration and intensity of rainfall events affect the number of beach closures. It is difficult to make comparisons as beach closures can be caused by prolonged wet weather in "wet years" as well as high intensity short duration rainfall events in low rainfall years.
- Part of the response in addressing past beach closure problems associated with overflows and spills from sewerage systems involves increased monitoring.
 Increased monitoring has the potential to reveal more problems. Aggressive monitoring elsewhere in the state or in the country might reveal different patterns of beach closures.


A survey of coastal states (including the Great Lakes) by the Natural Resources Defense Council showed that California has led the nation in beach closures recently. California had 57% and 40% of the total reported beach closures in 1993 and 1994, respectively. As with the California county comparison, consistent data do not exist on a national basis to complete a valid trend analysis. Differences between California and other states are difficult to interpret, because standards, monitoring, reporting and closure practices vary from state to state. For example, a permanent closure at the international border in San Diego was a single closure event for the purpose of annual reporting, even though it involved 365 days of closure in 1994.
