Example of 2-Year Average Fee Impact

Small Lab with 1-10 FOAs using ELAP for Assessment: 15.1% Large Lab with 350+ FOAs not using ELAP for Assessment: 16.67%

Amendment Application Fee

Currently, a laboratory applying for amendment accreditation pays a non-refundable Administrative Fee of \$200. Staff proposes removing the Administrative Fee and instead charging a non-refundable Amendment Application Fee with a fee of \$1,500 for amendment applications with 49 or fewer FOAs, and \$2,500 for 50 or greater FOAs.

Amendment Assessment Fee

Labs using ELAP for assessing amendment additions of FOAs to their accreditation currently are charged \$1,000 regardless of when during a lab's accreditation cycle an amendment is applied for. Staff proposes tiered Amendment Assessment Fees: 1) A standalone amendment assessment fee of \$5,000 when amendments are made outside of the renewal application, or 2) when an amendment is added on to a renewal assessment \$1,000 (plus the standard renewal \$5,000 assessment fee for a total of \$6,000).
