NPDES PERMIT NO. CA0006335

ENFORCEMENT ORDER FOR ISSUANCE OF A TIME SCHEDULE

U. S. NAVY, NAVAL SUPPLY CENTER
POINT MOLATE SITE
CONTRA COSTA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, finds that:

1. This Board, on September 19, 1978, adopted Order No. 78-75 prescribing waste discharge requirements for U. S. Navy, Naval Supply Center, Point Molate Site (hereinafter discharger) in accordance with the statutory requirements of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and the California Water Code.
2. Order No. 78-75 contains an immediate compliance date as required by the Federal Act for achieving all effluent limitations except Effluent Limitation A.4 (toxicity) and Prohibition C.2 (10:1 minimum initial dilution). Said Order requires the discharger to submit a schedule for compliance with A.4 and C.2 by June 1, 1979.
3. The discharger has achieved consistent compliance with Effluent Limitation A.4 (toxicity).
4. The discharger has submitted a time schedule to achieve full compliance with C.2.
5. The approval of the construction project has been delayed because of delays in congressional appropriation.
6. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to adopt a time schedule for compliance.
7. The Board in a public hearing heard and considered all comments pertaining to this discharger's ability to achieve compliance.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that in accordance with Water Code Section 13300 the discharger shall comply with Prohibition C.2 (10:1 minimum initial dilution) of Order No. 78-75 according to the following time schedule:

<u>1. Task</u>	<u>Completion Date</u>
Begin design	January 1, 1981
Complete design	June 1, 1981
Begin construction	December 1, 1981
Complete construction	July 1, 1982
Start-up operation	September 1, 1982
Full compliance	December 1, 1982

2. The discharger is required to file with the Board by February 1, 1981 and every six months thereafter, a progress report toward compliance with the above time schedule.
3. This Order expires on October 1, 1983.

This Board declares that it shall not undertake further enforcement action to bring the discharger into compliance with effluent limitations immediately as contained in Order No. 78-75 provided:

- a. The discharger complies fully with all terms of the time schedule contained in this Order;
- b. Circumstances do not occur which would warrant modification of the permit or time schedule; and
- c. Circumstances do not occur which would warrant an action under Section 504 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.

This action taken by this Board pertaining to the time schedule does not preclude the possibility of actions to enforce the permit by third parties pursuant to Section 505 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.
