Public Notice Project Description	 February 23, 2017 – March 16, 2017 The purpose of this project is to maintain the capacity of key watercourses in the County, to preserve exiting conveyance capacity, and to prevent accumulation of obstructing vegetation and sediment. The project activities include: Selectively removing vegetation from channels; Appling herbicide to vegetation that reduces channel capacity; Conducting channel shaping and bank stabilization to redirect flows causing bank erosion or failure; Repairing unlined channel banks that have been damaged from flood flows; Maintaining flood control devices that are damaged, such as storm culverts, wire revetments, slope pavings, lined channels, etc.; Installing grade control structures to reduce erosion associated with channel downcutting; Maintaining lined channels by trimming overhanging
	vegetation, repairing damaged concrete sections, and removing accumulated sediment from the channel bottom; • Constructing/maintaining access ways or ramps to gain access to channels, with removal upon completion if possible;
	 Establishing and maintaining pilot channels; and Using the Stream Simulation Method for removal of Maria Ygnacio Main and East Branch, Cold Springs, San Ysidro, and Rattlesnake Debris Basins.

Proposed mitigation consists of 28 acres of mixed wetland, riparian, and upland habitat at the Los Carneros Mitigation Bank.
The Santa Barbara County Flood Control District filed an Environmental Impact Report on December 11, 2001.

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
