Even though the 2010 permit is already too weak, Boeing has violated it numerous times and is being fined so minimally the water remains contaminated.

We need more stringent laws to protect public health not relax them even more.

Is it true that the Regional Water Board is headed by Charlie Stringer who works for Renewable Resources that is employed by Boeing?

In the scientific community, that is called biased interest.
