Watershed Regulatory Section/Municipal Permitting Unit/Contaminated Sediments

State of the Los Angeles River Watershed Conference

Over the past five years, the Los Angeles River Watershed Monitoring Program (LARWMP) has conducted monitoring throughout the watershed to characterize the current condition of streams and the health risks associated with recreating in the freshwater lakes and streams. This is the first time that the watershed has been assessed in a comprehensive fashion and the results were presented at a conference held on October 10, 2013, at the Deaton Auditorium in downtown Los Angeles.

Numerous agents are expected to significantly alter conditions in the watershed and river over the next decade. At this symposium, some of the more important change agents were highlighted and how these can be expected to alter water quality condition and recreational opportunities over the next ten years was discussed. These discussions will assist watershed managers in adaptively managing the watershed's surface waters.

The symposium was opened with presentations by Nancy Steele, Executive Director of the Council for Watershed Health, Eric Garcetti, mayor of the City of Los Angeles, and Emily Gabel-Luddy, mayor of the City of Burbank. These speakers emphasized the need for more recreational opportunities, more habitat and more access to the river system. Mitch O'Farrell, LA City Councilman discussed the benefits of the Los Angeles River Revitalization Plan and Carol Armstrong, City of LA, discussed its link to the LA River Ecosystem Restoration Feasibility Study recently released by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Josephine Axt, Corps of Engineers, was unable to attend due to the federal government shutdown). The proposed restoration alternatives range in cost from \$450 million to \$1 billion. Although all four alternatives under consideration would provide benefits, the City of Los Angeles (and apparently many other attendees at the symposium) recommends alternative 20, the most expensive, but also the most beneficial, option.

Kristy Morris, Council for Watershed Health, presented highlights of the results from five years of monitoring in the watershed. While there are some sites in the upper watershed that support healthy biological communities, overall most of the watershed is in poor condition. Approximately 20 percent of the samples collected exceeded bacteriological standards ($E. \alpha h$) for water contact recreation. Largemouth bass contained high concentrations of mercury, particularly those collected from Legg Lake, indicating a risk for human consumption (a major concern, since a recent survey found that 23 percent of local fishermen consume their catch). The five-year report summarizing these findings is scheduled to be released in November 2013 and will be available at the Council for Watershed Health's website (<u>http://www.watershedhealth.org/</u> <u>Default.aspx</u>).

Two presentations focused on the history of the watershed (Gary Hildebrand, Los Angeles County Department of Public Works) and the change in perception of the system from the past characterization as a flood control channel to the modern view of a valuable river (Lewis Mac Adams, Friends of the Los Angeles River). Several presentations discussed a future of change for the river, including the role of Los Angeles Urban Waters Federal Partnership (presented by Pauline Louie, Urban Waters Watershed Ambassador, on behalf of John Kemmerer, USE PA), the role of green infrastructure (Adel Hagekhali, City of Los Angeles), management of Angeles National Forest (presented by Edward Belden, National Forest Foundation, on behalf of Tom Contreras, Angeles Forest Supervisor), the river as recreational space (Joe Edmiston, Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy), cleaning the waters under the MS4 Stormwater Permit and TMDL requirements (Shahram Kharaghani, City of Los Angeles), and resolving conflicting uses of treated wastewater for reclamation and in-stream habitat needs (Traci Minamide, City of Los Angeles). Integrated Regional Water Management Meetings

The Watershed Coordinator participated in meetings of Integrated Regional Water Management (IRWM) committees including those for the Greater Los Angeles County Region's South Bay Subregion (October 8) and for the Watersheds Coalition of Ventura County Region's Santa Clara River Watershed Committee (September 26). All four IRWM Regions are finalizing their IRWM Plans, either as updates or as a first edition document in the case of the Gateway Region. All four Regions submitted applications to the Department of Water Resources for the next round of Proposition 84 funds for implementation projects; funding recommendations have been released and are available for public comment prior to being finalized.

Other Meetings Attended

The Santa Monica Mountains Watershed Council met on September 26; Cindy Lin of USEPA presented a summary of the TMDL for sedimentation and nutrients to address benchic community impairments prepared by the agency.

Groundwater Permitting and Land Disposal Program

Puente Hills Landfill

The Puente Hills Landfill (Landfill), which is located in an unincorporated area of Los Angeles County near the City of Whittier, is scheduled to cease waste disposal operations after October 30, 2013. The Landfill encompasses approximately 1,365 acres of land, of which approximately 700 acres are utilized for landfilling, and is currently the largest landfill in the Los Angeles Region and one of the largest in the United States. It began operations in1957 as a small regional dump. Since then, approximately 127 million tons of wastes have been disposed of at the Landfill. The site has been regulated under waste discharge requirements (WDRs) since 1959. Recently, the Regional Board adopted Order No. R4-2013-0154 on October 3, 2013, that includes closure and post-closure maintenance WDRs for the Landfill.

The Discharger (County Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County) submitted final closure and postclosure maintenance plans for the Landfill In December 2011 that were approved by Regional Board staff. The final cover system approved for the Landfill is a water balance (also known as evapotranpiration, or ET) design that controls percolation by balancing the water storage capacity of a soil cover and the ability of plants and the atmosphere to extract water stored in the soil. The construction of final covers at the side slopes of the Landfill has been going on since 1991. Currently, approximately 346 acres of side slope final cover at the Landfill has been constructed. The construction of final cover at the top decks of the Landfill will start immediately following the cease of waste disposal operations and will take approximately one year to complete.

Post-closure maintenance of the Landfill will be conducted a minimum of 30 years or until regulatory agencies, including the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery, the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services, and Regional Board, determine that the Landfill no longer poses a threat to public health and safety and the environment. During the post-closure maintenance period, the Discharger is responsible for the maintenance of the environmental control systems (i.e. landfill gas collection and destruction, leachate collection and disposal, storm water conveyance, groundwater monitoring systems) at the Landfill and take any necessary corrective actions for the protection of public health and safety and the environment.

Malibu Septic Prohibition Implementation Updates

On September 24, 2013 Regional Board staff met with City of Malibu (City) staff and their consultants for a Septic Prohibition implementation update. The City is scheduled to complete the pilot tests of the aquifer injection project soon. The pilot tests inject drinking water into aquifers under WDRs Order No. 2012-0010 -DWQ in order to understand the aquifer response which will be used to evaluate future injection disposal. Additional hydrogeological information and aquifer response data collected at monitoring wells during injection will be used to recalibrate the model previously developed based on pumping test results. The draft report for the aquifer injection project is tentatively scheduled to be available for internal review in November 2013 and will be available for public review next year.

Concurrently, the City is also working on the design of mechanical systems, civil structure, collection system, and siting for the Centralized Wastewater Treatment Plant. The design is estimated to be 40% complete. The report of waste discharge (RoWD), application for the Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs), will be submitted shortly.

For the case closure sites above, a total of **9,282** tons of impacted soils were excavated and **60,453** pounds of hydrocarbons were removed by soil vapor extraction system. In addition, **4,932,041** gallons of ground-water were treated and **850** gallons of gasoline free product (LNAPL) were removed.

Former kast Tank Farm Property, Carousel Residential Neighborhood Tract, Carson Dr. Teklewold Ayalew

The activities related to the site investigation and cleanup work performed during the months of September and October 2013 include the following:

 On September 24, 2013, the Regional Board held a California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) scoping meeting. The meeting was set as an open house with a series of posters describing the objectives and processes involved in the CEQA procedural requirement. This scoping meeting is intended to reach the community and to gather input on potential environmental impacts and mitigation measures anticipated with the implementation of the upcoming Shell's site cleanup approach or Remedial Action Plan.

On October 7, 2013, the Regional Board received a comment letter on the Proposed California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Scoping prepared by Integrated Resource Management on behalf of

the Carousel community and the City of Carson.

- 2. On September 27, 2013, the Regional Board management held a technical consultation meeting with Shell and consultants and discussed Shell's plan to address Regional Board comments and requirements on the review of Site-Specific Cleanup Goal Report (SSCG) Report. On August 21, 2013, the Regional Board issued a response on the review of the SSCG submitted by Shell. Geosyntec consultants discussed how various remedial alternatives under consideration are tied to cleanup levels that Shell intends to propose.
- 3. As a follow-up to the request made during the CEQA scoping meeting, on October 3, 2013, the Regional Board staff discussed the results of the residential sampling reports for 24402 Ravenna Avenue and 24739 Ravenna Avenue, with the owners, Ms. Ana Bartolome and Ms. Angelina Arnado, respectively. Regional Board staff have also provided electronic copies of residential reports to property owners when contacted.
- 4 On October 1, 2013, the Regional Board and OEHHA staff completed the review of ten (10) *Final Interim Residential Sampling Reports* and the Regional Board issued a directive for a follow-up action.
- 5. On October 10, 2013, the Regional Board management and staff participated in a discussion moderated by the City of Carson Planning Officer issues related to the Carson City Council Resolution, declaring the Existence of an Emergency in the Vicinity of the Carousel Tract Neighborhood due to the presence of Explosive Methane Gas, Carcinogenic Benzene and other Chemicals of Concern, and issuing such findings or Orders as are Authorized by Law.

On July 30, 2013, the Regional Board received a letter from the City of Carson, that described the intent of the Resolution is to encourage the State of California and the County of Los Angeles to take appropriate steps to address and mitigate the urgent environmental condition within the Carousel Tract.

- 6. Sampled soil, soil vapor, and indoor air at individual residential properties as access became available. The completed residential sampling activity as of October 4, 2013 is as follows:
 - 268 homes have been screened for methane (94%);
 - 267 homes have had soils sampled and vapor probes installed (94%);
 - 266 homes have had sub-slab soil vapor probes sampled (93%);
 - 243 homes have had indoor air sampled (85%); and
 - 166 of 243 total have had 2nd round of indoor air sampled (58%)

Former Athens Tank Farm / Ujima and Earvin Magic Johnson Regional Park, Los Angeles Dr. Teklewold Ayalew

The activities related to the environmental site investigation of the Former Athens Tank Farm during the months of September and October 2013 are summarized as follows:

1. Per the Regional Board approved *Remedial Action Plan – Phase I* (RAP), the construction and installation of the Phase I Soil Vapor Extraction (Phase I SVE) remediation system is ongoing. Currently saw cutting of the main trench line and lateral lines to the SVE wells on Clovis Avenue and 126th Street is nearly complete. System piping and pressure testing for those soil vapor

extraction wells north of 126th Street and the main line on Clovis Avenue are completed. Trench backfill and street re-paving north of 126th Street were completed along with excavation of the main trench on Clovis Avenue, south of 126th Street.

The Phase I SVE system includes a six month period to gather performance monitoring data for use in design of the Phase II SVE system, which will include the area currently occupied by the former Ujima Village Apartment Complex. Based on the results of Phase I SVE performance monitoring are evaluated and Phase II SVE design parameters will be developed.

2. On October 10, 2013, the Regional Board completed the review of a document titled *Supplemental Soil Vapor Delineation Report* and issued a response that directed Exxon Mobil to install additional soil vapor probes at Animo Watts Charter High School property, Centennial High School property, conduct re-sampling of soil vapor at probes where off-site measured concentrations of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in vapor samples exceeded the California Human Health Screening Level (CHHSL) and/or methane exceeded Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC, 2005) threshold of 5,000 parts per million by volume (ppmv), and to revise the report addressing concerns identified in the report.

The DTSC is currently working on access agreement with the Animo Watts and Centennial High School for Exxon Mobil to perform the soil vapor probe installation and sampling work directed by the Regional Board.

- 3. The Regional Board has received the Second Quarter 2013 Groundwater Monitoring Report for 20 shallow and 20 deep groundwater monitoring wells at locations on- and off-Site. Shallow groundwater elevations ranged from 45.15 to 61.09 feet above mean sea level and of the 20 on- and off-Site wells constructed in the shallow zone, nine wells did not contain groundwater during the Second Quarter 2013 monitoring event.
- T he highest concentration of TPH-g in shallow groundwater (29,000 μ g/L) was measured in the sample collected from on-Site well ATF-8A. Of the 20 on- and off-Site wells constructed in the deep zone, non-aqueous phase liquid (NAPL) was detected in two wells. In the deeper zone, there is an apparent groundwater mound near wells ATF-3B and ATF-4B. The highest concentration of TPH-g in deep groundwater (12,000 μ g/L) was measured in the sample collected from on-Site well ATF-5B. Trends in TPH and benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and total xylenes (BTEX) concentrations are generally not apparent in analytical results from the shallow wells but are generally stable or decreasing in the deep wells.
